SUNDAY MASS READINGS FOR APRIL

Sunday, March 27th (Fourth Sunday of Lent)

First Reading from Joshua 5:9, 10-12 - The Israelites were encamped on the plains of Jerico and celebrated the feast of Passover. The next day, they ate the produce of the land, and when they were able to eat food produced by the land itself, the manna from heaven ceased.

Responsorial Psalm Ps 34:2-3, 4-5, 6-7 - "Taste and see the goodness of the Lord."

Second Reading from Paul's Second Letter to the Corinthians 5:17-21 - The old things have passed away: the new things have come in the name of Christ, who is a new creation. God has reconciled the world to Him in the name of Christ, and so we are ambassadors for Christ as if God were speaking through us.

Gospel of Luke 15:1-3, 11-32 - When Jesus ate with the tax collectors and sinners, the Pharisees and scribes complained that Jesus welcomed sinners. So Jesus told them the recognizable parable of the Prodigal Son. When you read Luke 15:11-32, read it three times: Once from the perspective of the father who last a son but regained him. Then from the perspective of the returning son and his squandering the wealth but was repatriated with the father. And finally from the perspective of the other son who grumbled that his father forgave the Prodigal and welcomed him back with open arms.

Sunday, April 3rd (Fifth Sunday of Lent)

First Reading from Isaiah 43:16-21 - The Lord who led the Chosen out of Egypt does something new. He makes rivers in the desert for the people to drink from. He formed the people for Himself so they might praise Him.

Responsorial Psalm 126:1-6 - "The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy."

Second Reading from Paul's Letter to the Philippians 3:8-14 - For the sake of knowing Christ, Paul has accepted the loss of many things that had previously been important to him. He continues in the hope of gaining spiritual maturity. He forgets what is behind him and looks only to what lies ahead; that is, the prize of God's having called him.

Gospel of John 8:1-11 The well-known story of the Scribes and Pharisees asking Jesus what should be done to a woman caught in adultery. The Law of Moses apparently condemns her to being stoned. Jesus writes a message in the dirt (don't we wish we knew what He wrote?) and utters the famous line: ""Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." The Scribes and Pharisees left in shame and Jesus told the woman that He would not condemn her and that she should go and sin no more.

Sunday, April 10th (Palm Sunday)

Procession with Palms - Luke 19:28-40 - The full story of the triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem, riding on a colt with the people spreading their cloaks and waiving palm branches as they proclaimed, "Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord."

First Reading from Isaiah 50:4-7 - Isaiah proclaims that the Lord has opened his ears to hear and his mouth to proclaim God's word to the weary. The Lord is his help and thus he is not put to shame and will not be disgraced.

Responsorial Psalm 22:8-9, 17-20, 23-24 - " My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?"

Second Reading from Paul's Letter to the Philippians 2:6-11 - Jesus came to us in human form and became obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. God exulted Him and bestowed on Him the name Jesus, to which every knee on earth should bend and every tongue should profess that Jesus Christ is Lord.

Gospel of Luke 22:14—23:56 - Luke's (long) version starting with the Last Supper where Jesus instituted the Eucharist and continuing through the betrayal, the Garden of Gethsemane, the arrest, the trial with Pilate, the Way of the Cross, the Crucifixion, the death of Jesus, and His burial - with a variety of significant experiences and stories during these events.

CONTINUED SUNDAY MASS READINGS FOR APRIL

Saturday, April 16th (Easter Vigil)

Seven possible readings from the Hebrew Scriptures can be presented at this Easter Vigil Mass to tell the story of the creation of the world and the history of the Israelite nation from the prophets to the captivity in Egypt to the Passover to their arrival in the Holy Land. A number of these readings will be chosen to be proclaimed at this Mass. These readings will be taken from the following: Genesis 1:1-2:2 / Genesis 22:1-18 / Exodus 14:15-15:1 / Isaiah 54:5-14 / Isaiah 55:1-11 / Baruch 3:9-15, 32-4:4 / and Ezekiel 36:16-17, 18-28.

Responsorial Psalms will be presented between each of the above readings.

Epistle Reading from Paul's Letter to the Romans 6:3-11 - We were baptized into Christ through His death. We shall thus live with Christ and overcome the finality of death.

Gospel of Luke 24:1-12 - The story of the women going to the tomb on the Sunday morning and finding the stone rolled away. The tomb was empty and two angels there told them that Jesus had predicted his Resurrection. The women went back and reported what they saw and Peter went to the tomb to see for himself that the burial clothes were there alone.

Sunday, April 17th (Easter Sunday)

First Reading from Acts of the Apostles 10:34, 37-43 - Peter proclaimed the story of Jesus from His baptism through His teaching, ministry, and miracles to His crucifixion, death, and Resurrection on the third day. Peter validated that Jesus had appeared to him following His Resurrection and that all who bear witness to Jesus will have their sins forgiven.

Responsorial Psalm 118:1-2, 16-17, 22-23 - "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad."

Second Reading from Paul's Letter to the Colossians 3:1-4 - We have been raised with Christ. Seek what is above and you will appear with Him in glory.

Gospel of John 20:1-9 - When Mary Magdeline went to the tomb on Sunday morning, found the stone rolled away and the time empty, she went and reported it to Peter and John. These two went to the tomb to see for themselves, and found it as she had reported. They then believed what had been prophesied before that Jesus had to be raised from the dead.

Sunday, April 24th (Second Sunday of Easter - Divine Mercy Sunday)

First Reading from Acts of the Apostles 5:12-16 - Many people in the area of Jerusalem gathered and brought their sick and those possessed by unclean spirits to be healed by the apostles. The apostles performed signs and wonders by healing those who believed in the power of Jesus.

Responsorial Psalm 118:2-4, 13-15, 22-24 - "Give thanks to the Lord for He is good, His love is everlasting."

Second Reading from the Book of Revelation 1:9-13, 17-19 - John tells the story of his proclaiming God's word and giving testimony about Jesus. He tells how he heard a voice from heaven telling him to record what he was seeing and witnessing. John visions the glorified Christ in His splendor and he was afraid. Jesus tells him not to be afraid, that He is the beginning and the end (the alpha and the omega) who was once dead but is now alive. And John was amazed.

Gospel of John 20:19-31 - On the evening following the Resurrection, the disciples were afraid and locked themselves in a room. Jesus stood in their midst and they rejoiced. Jesus said, "Peace be with you," and showed them His hands and His side. Jesus breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit." One of the eleven, Thomas, was not with them and when they reported to Thomas that the had seen the Lord, he did not believe them. "Unless I can put my fingers into the nail holes in his hands and my hand into his side, I will not believe." A week later, they were together again and this time, Thomas was with them. Jesus appeared and told Thomas to put his finger in His hands and his hand into His side, and Thomas said, "My Lord and my God." Jesus told him that "more blessed are those who don't see but who believe."



POST-EASTER

Have you noticed that since Easter, the first readings for daily and Sunday Masses are not taken from the Old Testament, but from the Acts of the Apostles? This shows the emphasis being placed on the Resurrected Jesus and the Church that has developed since His life.

LENTEN OBLIGATIONS

With certain medical exceptions, all the faithful who have reached 14 years of age are required to abstain from eating meat on all the Fridays of the Lenten Season.

In addition (except again for medical situations), the faithful between the ages of 18 and 59 are bound to fast on Good Friday (April 15) by prayerfully limiting oneself to one full meal and avoiding food between meals. Light sustenance may be taken on two other occasions during the day.



RELAY REMINDER

The Relay for Life event this year will be held from 9:00am on August 6th to 9:00 am on August 7th. Holy Family will again make luminary bags available to honor and remember loved ones stricken with cancer. A luminary ceremony will be held after the 5:15 Mass on July 30th. - 1. Father, forgive them for they know not what they are doing. (Luke 23:34)
- 2. Assuredly, I say to you, today you will be with Me in Paradise. (Luke 23:43)
- Woman, behold your son! Son, behold your mother! (John 19:26-27)
- My God, my God, why have you forsaken Me? (Matthew 27:45-46)
- 5. I thirst. (John 19:28)
- 6. It is finished. (John 19:30)
- Father, into your hands I commend My spirit. (Luke 23:46)
