Sunday, May 1st (Third Sunday of Easter)

First Reading from Acts of the Apostles 5:27-32, 40-41 - The apostles are made to stand trial before the Sanhedrin for continuing to teach about the resurrected Jesus. The high priest ordered them to stop teaching in His name, but Peter replied that they were bound to obey God rather than humans. After again being ordered not to teach, they were released.

Responsorial Psalm 30:2, 4, 5-6, 11-12, 13 - "I will praise you, Lord, for you have rescued me."

Second Reading from the Book of Revelation 5:11-14 - During John's vision as recorded in this book, he saw and heard the voices of many angels surrounding the throne. And with them, every creature from the earth and the sea were worshiping the One on the throne: "To the one who sits on the throne and to the Lamb, be blessing and honor, glory and might, forever and ever."

Gospel of John 21:1-19 - After the apostles had fished all night and caught nothing, they headed back to shore. Jesus was standing there (but they did not recognize Him). He told them to go back and cast their nets again. They caught more fish than their boat could handle and Peter realized that it was the Lord who ordered them back to sea. With that, Peter jumped in the water and swam to shore. When the other apostles returned to the land, they saw a fire there and bread to eat. Jesus told them to cook the fish so they could all eat breakfast. This was the third time Jesus had revealed himself after His resurrection. The rest of this Gospel story is the well-know dialogue between Peter and Jesus who asked Peter three times if he loved Him, and if so, follow Him and feed His lambs and feed His sheep.

Sunday, May 8th (Fouirth Sunday of Easter)

First Reading from Acts of the Apostles 13:14, 43-52 - Many Jews and converts to Judaism followed Paul and Barnabas into the temple on the Sabbath to hear them preach. They told the Jews that the Word of God had been spoken to them first but since they didn't heed it, they were unworthy of eternal life and Paul and Barnabas would now turn their teaching to the Gentiles, who were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit. This angered the Jews who expelled Paul and Barnabas from their territory.

Responsorial Psalm 100:1-2, 3, 5 - "We are his people, the sheep of his flock."

Second Reading from the Book of Revelation 7:9, 14-17 - John's vision continues, as he witnesses a great multitude from every nation, race, people, and tongue - all standing around the throne wearing white garments. They were worshipping God day and night and they had neither hunger nor thirst since the Lamb on the throne was shepherding them.

Gospel of John 10:27-30 - Jesus said that he was the shepherd and that His sheep know him and follow Him. He gives the sheep eternal life and none will ever perish and none will ever be taken away from Jesus or the Father.

Sunday, May 15th (Fifth Sunday of Easter)

First Reading from the Acts of the Apostles 14:21-27 - Paul and Barnabas returned to Antioch. They appointed elders for each church and reminded them that they should pray and fast, and then commended them to the Lord. The two disciples continued their journeys to Pisidia, Pamphylia, Perga and Attalia, and then back to Antioch where they reported the work they had accomplished by opening the door of faith to the Gentiles where they had preached about Jesus.

Responsorial Psalm 145:8-13 - "I will praise your name forever, my King and my God."

Second Reading from the Book of Revelation 21:1-5 - John's vision is of the new earth and the new heaven, the old having passed away. He also saw the new Jerusalem, the former having passed away. The voice on the throne proclaimed, "The old order has passed away. Behold, I make all things new."

Gospel of John 13:31-35 - At the Last Supper Jesus said, "My children, I will be with you only a little while longer. I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

CONTINUED SUNDAY MASS READINGS FOR APRIL

Sunday, May 22nd (Sixth Sunday of Easter)

First Reading from Acts of the Apostles 15:1-2, 22-29 - Some dissension arose among the Jews that Paul and Barnabas were preaching to over the issue of circumcision.

Responsorial Psalm 67:2-3, 5, 6, 8 - "O God, let all the nations praise you!"

Epistle Reading from the Book of Revelation 21:10-14, 22-23 - The angel showed John the glory of heaven with no need for sun or moon. The glory of God gave it light. He saw the New Jerusalem with twelve gates where twelve other angels were stationed and on which were inscribed the twelve apostles of the Lamb.

Gospel of John 14:23-29 - Jesus tells his disciples that He leaves them peace, that he will go away but will return, that He will send the Holy Spirit who will be sent in the Father's name and who will teach them everything they need to know.

Sunday, May 29th (Celebration of the Feast of the Ascension)

First Reading from Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11 - The beginning of Luke's account of the Acts of the Apostles (see below), wherein Jesus appeared to the apostles after His Resurrection and was taken up to Heaven forty days later.

Responsorial Psalm 47:2-3, 6-7, 8-9 - "God mounts his throne to shouts of joy: a blare of trumpets for the Lord."

Second Reading from Paul's Letter to the Ephesians 1:17-23 - Paul wishes that the Spirit will give the people wisdom and revelation resulting in understanding of Jesus and love for Him. Believe that God worked great deeds in Jesus and raised Him from the dead and seated Him at His right hand in heaven.

Gospel of Luke 24:46-53 - Jesus preordains that He will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, and that the apostles should preach repentance for sins in His name. Jesus assures them that He is sending the promise of the Father to them. Jesus then took the apostles to a mountain, blessed them, and departed from them, being taken up to heaven. The apostles returned to Jerusalem with great joy and began to praise God in the temple.

ACTS OF THE APOSTLES

This fifth book of the Christian Testament (the New Testament) follows the four Gospels in its positioning in the bible. It is clear that this testimony was written by Luke as a continuation of his Gospel and provides witness of the fledgling Church in the First Century. It commences: "In my first account, Theophilus, I dealt with all that Jesus did and taught until the day he was taken up to heaven . . . " It continues with the apostles choosing Matthias to take the place of Judas, and proceeds to tell the story of the Descent of the Holy Spirit (as we will celebrate next month at Pentecost). Then story after story of Peter and the others curing the sick and preaching throughout the land. The story of Paul's conversion follows as well as a history of Paul's travels to new churches throughout the entire region.

Why mention all of this? It's because during the Easter Season (the Sundays of Easter leading up to Pentecost), the first readings are not taken from the Hebrew Scriptures (the Old Testament) as they typically are the rest of the Church Year, but from the Acts of the Apostles. Readings from Acts are also used during this Easter Season at all daily Masses as a first reading. Why so? Acts is unique - it is not a Gospel nor a letter. It tells the story of the people coming together in the First Century following the Ascension of Jesus as they form themselves into a true Church and it records the history of the early Church. Once Jesus is gone, they (and we) need to learn of the ways that He continues to be alive and present in the community of believers. And that is what we are looking for in these weeks following Easter; so it's only natural that the readings should so heavily rely on this story of the early Church, the Acts of the Apostles.



HOLY FAMILY CATHOLIC CHURCH CHALLENGE FOR MAY

(B) and (C) are true as you can read in Luke's Gospel, Chapter 1, Verses 36-40. (A) is suspect though, because there is no clear indication in the Gospels that the two were <u>first cousins</u>. Different translations use terms such as "relatives" or "kinswomen" to describe their kindred connection - but not really "cousins" as we use the term. (D) Mary did indeed travel from Nazareth, but Elizabeth was not in Jerusalem - she was in a town in Judah. And (E) is close as the Gospel says that Mary remained with Elizabeth for 3 months, but she left before the birth of John. Again, read Luke 1:36-40 and add 1:56-57.

OTHER MAY OBSERVANCES

- May 13: Feast of Our Lady of
 Fatima the short version of the
 story is that the Blessed Mother
 appeared to 3 young children in the
 fields near Fatima, a small village in
 Portugal, in 1917. Appearing on the
 13th of the month for six months,
 she told them to encourage the
 people to pray the rosary for peace

- May 26: Ascension Thursday Exactly forty days after the Resurrection and after He had appeared
 to the apostles numerous times,
