My Dear Faithful Parishioners,



SUNDAY MASS READINGS FOR JUNE

Sunday, May 29th (Celebration of the Feast of the Ascension)

First Reading from Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11 - The beginning of Luke's account of the Acts of the Apostles (see below), wherein Jesus appeared to the apostles after His Resurrection and was taken up to Heaven forty days later.

Responsorial Psalm 47:2-3, 6-7, 8-9 - "God mounts His throne to shouts of joy: a blare of trumpets for the Lord."

Second Reading from Paul's Letter to the Ephesians 1:17-23 - Paul wishes that the Spirit will give the people wisdom and revelation resulting in understanding of Jesus and love for Him. We should all believe that God worked great deeds in Jesus and raised Him from the dead and seated Him at His right hand in heaven.

Gospel of Luke 24:46-53 - Jesus preordains that He will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, and that the apostles should preach repentance for sins in His name. Jesus assures them that He is sending the promise of the Father to them. Jesus then took the apostles to a mountain, blessed them, and departed from them, being taken up to heaven. The apostles returned to Jerusalem with great joy and began to praise God in the temple.

Sunday, June 5th (Pentecost Sunday)

First Reading from Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11 - The story of Pentecost with the apostles hearing the wind, having tongues of fire appear over their heads, and being filled with the Hoy Spirit; and then proclaiming the word of the Lord to all those outside who were able to hear the apostles' message each in their own language.

Responsorial Psalm 104:1, 24, 29-30, 31, 34 - "Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth."

Second Reading from Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians 12:3-7, 12-13 - There are different spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; different service but the same Lord; different workings but the same God. We are all one body in the Lord and in the Spirit, whether Jew or Greek, slave or free.

Gospel of John 20:19-23 - Jesus had appeared to the disciples in the locked room and told them, "Peace be with you." He breathed on them and told them they would receive the Holy Spirit and anyone's sins they forgave would be forgiven.

Sunday, June 12th (Feast of the Holy Trinity)

First Reading from Proverbs 8:22-31 - The Wisdom of God has existed from all time and even before all time. God's wisdom was present at the creation of the world and at the creation of the human race.

Responsorial Psalm 8:4-5, 6-7, 8-9 - "O Lord, our God, how wonderful your name in all the earth!"

Second Reading from Paul's Letter to the Romans 5:1-5 - The Spirit has been given to us and the love of God has been poured out for us. We have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. We have been justified by our faith.

Gospel of John 16:12-15 - Everything that the Father has, Jesus also has; and Jesus will declare truth to all who hear Him. Jesus promises that the Spirit will guide everyone in learning and understanding the truth.

Sunday, June 19th (Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Jesus - Corpus Christi Sunday)

First Reading from Genesis 14:18-20 - Melchizedek, the high priest, blessed Abram in the name of God who created the heavens and the earth and who delivered Abram's foes into his hands.

Responsorial Psalm Ps 110:1, 2, 3, 4 - "You are a priest for ever, in the line of Melchizedek."

CONTINUED SUNDAY MASS READINGS FOR JUNE

Second Reading from Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians 11:23-26 - Paul retells the Words of Institution of the Blessed Sacrament that Jesus first used at the Last Supper. These words are spoken at every Mass as the celebrant says them over the bread and wine, miraculously turning the elements onto the Body and Blood of Jesus (thus today's remembrance: "Do this in remembrance of me," said the Lord.). The true presence of Jesus within the Eucharist is one of the most important tenets of our Catholic belief and faith.

Gospel of Luke 9:11-17 - The story of the feeding of the five thousand. The Miracle of the five loaves and two fish that were blessed by Jesus and were used to feed the entire crowd. This is one of the miracles of Jesus that is captured and retold in all four Gospels.

Sunday, June 26th (Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time)

First Reading from the First Book of Kings 19:16, 19-21 - Elijah was told by the Lord that he should go and anoint Elisha to be the prophet who succeeds Elijah .When anointed, Elisha began to follow Elijah as his attendant.

Responsorial Psalm 16:1-2, 5, 7-8, 9-10, 11 - "You are my inheritance, O Lord."

Epistle Reading from Paul's Letter to the Galicians 5:1, 13-18 - The people were called to be free, not slaves. Paul exhorts the people to use that freedom to serve one another through love not to dominate over others. They should live by the Spirit and not by the demands of the flesh.

Gospel of Luke 9:51-62 - On His journey to Jerusalem, Jesus was not welcomed by all whom He encountered. Jesus said that while the foxes have dens and the birds have nests, the Son of Man has nowhere to stay and rest. To those whom Jesus said, "Follow Me," many indicated they were not ready to leave all and follow Him. If you are fit for the Kingdom, you must be willing to follow Jesus wherever He goes.

The Sundays above have some special remembrances: Ascension, Pentecost, Corpus Christi - and the Feast of the Holy Trinity. To understand this last solemnity, we need to delve into the scripture and then consider how the Church viewed this doctrine after Jesus left this earth and after the Holy Spirit descended upon the apostles. The doctrine of the Trinity is encapsulated in Matthew 28:19, where Jesus instructs the apostles: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." In addition, the relationship of the Father, Son and Spirit appears in Paul's Second letter to the Corinthians (13:13) and in the Letter to the Hebrews (9:14). Early Church leaders, through divine revelation, understood that the Father, the Son and the Spirit are three divine persons who are a single divine being. This is a mystery of our faith that may require some praying, thinking and discussing.

FATHER FRED'S HOLY LANDS PILGRIMAGE

CHALLENGES FOR JUNE

(1) The word **Pentecost** is Greek and it means "50th day." (πέντε / pente) is the Greek word for five as in Pentagon or Pentateuch.) Fifty days after Easter Sunday, we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and their followers, and the beginning of their new ministry to make disciples of all nations. Pentecost was originally a Jewish holiday, which the Jews used to celebrate 50 days after the end of Passover. (2) Trick question: None of the Gospels tell the story of Pentecost; that is left up to the Acts of the Apostles to relate, as you'll see in the next answer. Each of the Gospels ends with Jesus being taken up to heaven at His Ascension; nothing beyond that and then Pentecost is ten days later. (3) Read Acts Chapter 2 for the full story. But before that, check out Acts 1:13-16 which tells us that the eleven apostles were present along with some women, including Mary, the



Mother of Jesus. Then read again Acts 2:1-4 about them all being together in one place and having the tongues of fire appear over each and then speaking the message of Jesus to all

assembled, each of whom understood the message in their own language. (4) It must have been a Honda: Remember that when the day of Pentecost arrived, the disciples were all together in one Accord!!
