FR. FRED'S CORNER

This month's Pastor's Corner is not <u>by</u> Father Fred but is <u>about</u> Father Fred and his remarkable journey to find us here at Holy Family Parish. The last week of July was our celebration week which we shared with Father on the 25th anniversary of his ordination.

Are you aware of the challenging and formidable tasks that go into ordination in Ghana? Father spent 14 years in the seminary, completing studies to earn a high school diploma and then a college degree and then attending the equivalent of graduate school to study spirituality, philosophy and theology. Fortyfour young men began the seminary at the same time as Father Fred but only 3 others were ordained with him on July 27, 1997.

Ask Father sometime about the rigors of his priestly training. Ask him about his late night studies in Latin and Hebrew and practicing French (due to the influence of the Ivory Coast), and his classes communicating in English and the local dialects of Dangbe and Ga.

Following ordination, Father taught high school in Ghana and then emigrated to the U.S. in 2005 - first to Brooklyn and then to studies in pastoral care on Long Island, also doing parish work there, and all the while working on a masters degree in religious studies in Queens. His hospital work on Long Island led him to the pastoral care/chaplain position he applied for at Queen of the Valley Hospital in Napa. When he was accepted to it in 2010, he drove across country and arrived in Napa. Originally he lived at St. Thomas Aquinas in the priests' residence and met Fr. Patrick Stephenson through his connection with the Napa Deanery. And the rest, as they say, is history. When Father Pat was contemplating his retirement, he encouraged Father Fred to look into the possibility of becoming parish administrator of Holy Family, which would allow him to move into our residence, which he did in 2011 (although he still did double duty as hospital chaplain and parish administrator). A while later, Bishop Vasa appointed Father to be pastor, and still later, Father left The Queen to concentrate his full attention on the parish.

The wheels of progress had already been in motion when Father Fred joined us, with the challenge facing us of building an actual church. We had the land, we had the plans, but we didn't have the financing. And off Father went as full-time pastor to make our church a reality, but that's another story for another day. SUNDAY MASS READINGS FOR AUGUST

Sunday, July 31st (Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time)

First Reading from Ecclesiastes 1:2; 2:21-23 - Vanity of vanities! All things are vain. To those who have labored in wisdom, knowledge and skill, to them profit comes to those who have toiled, even if they find sorrow and grief at night.

Responsorsial Psalm Ps 90:3-4, 5-6, 12-13, 14 and 17 - "If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts."

Epistle Reading from Paul's Letter to the Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11 - Seek what is above. Seek Christ who is seated at the right hand of God. Put to death those parts of you that are earthly such as immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, lying and the greed that is idolatry. Take off your old self and put on a new self. Christ is in all and you will appear with Christ in all His glory.

Gospel of Luke 12:13-21 - Jesus said to the crowd, "Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions." He then told the crowd the parable of the rich man who had a bountiful harvest but who did not have enough storage space. So he tore down his barns to build new larger ones so he could eat, drink and be merry with his possessions safely in storage. Jesus said that if the man's life ended that night, what good would be his earthy possessions? Do not store up possessions that are rich in what does not matter to God.

Sunday, August 7th (Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time)

First Reading from the Book of Wisdom 18:6-9 - A reminder about the night of the Passover, how the children of God offered sacrifices and established the divine institution which brings about salvation.

Responsorial Psalm 33:1, 12, 18-22 - "Blessed the people the Lord has chosen to be his own."

Epistle Reading from Hebrews 11:1-2, 8-19 - The importance of faith. Abraham had faith and obeyed when he was called upon by God. He had faith when he sojourned in the promised land. He had faith when God told him that his wife Sarah would have a child. He had faith when he anticipated a heavenly kingdom for himself and his family.

Gospel of Luke 12:32-48 - Treasure is in the afterlife, Jesus tells his disciples, not in goods and wealth. Jesus tells the parable of the vigilant servant who awaits the master's return to the home and is rewarded. And he tells them that the master of a house never knows when a thief might be coming, so he must always be vigilant himself. Jesus then explains the parable to Peter telling him that the servant must always make preparations for the master's return.

Sunday, August 14th (Twentieth Sunday on Ordinary Time)

First Reading from the Prophet Jeremiah 38:4-6, 8-10 - The story of Jeremiah whose prophesying led King Zedekiah's men to call for Jeremiah to be thrown into a cistern where there was no water or food and where he would perish. After this was done, a court official who had been moved by Jeremiah's preaching went to the king and begged for mercy for Jeremiah. The king then ordered the official to draw Jeremiah out of the cistern before he should die.

Responsorsial Psalm 40:2, 3, 4, 18 - "Lord, come to my aid!"

Epistle Reading from Hebrews 12:1-4 - The people should rid themselves off all burdens and all sin, and keep their eyes fixed on Jesus as their leader in faith. Jesus endured the cross and has taken His seat on the throne of God. He did all this for sinners so they would not lose heart. Resist sin, as Jesus did, even to the point of shedding blood.

Gospel of Luke 12:49-53 - Jesus said that He did not come to establish peace on the earth, but to establish division. Those divided must be baptized and Jesus's anguish will be great until this is accomplished. This may seem like a stark concept to us, so pay close attention to the homily that might be preached on this day.

CONTINUED SUNDAY MASS READINGS FOR AUGUST

Sunday, August 21st (Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time)

First Reading from the Prophet Isaiah 66:18-21 - The Lord gathers nations of every language and everyone will see the glory of God. God will send prophets and priests to distant lands who will proclaim God's glory and gather the people to the Lord and take them to the holy mountain near Jerusalem.

Responsorsial Psalm 117:1, 2 - "Go out to all the world and tell the Good News."

Epistle Reading from Hebrews 12:5-7, 11-13 - Do not become distressed when the Lord disciplines you. Do not lose heart when the Lord reprimands you. Endure these trials for the Lord is testing you as children, and what child is there who the father does not discipline? Later it will bring joy and righteousness in knowing that you are doing the will of God. All of this is to heal you and make you stronger and more virtuous.

Gospel of Luke 13:22-30 - When Jesus arrived in Jerusalem, someone asked Him whether only a very few people would be saved. Jesus answered the person by saying that many will try to enter the heavenly gate but will not be strong enough to do so. He then spoke the parable of the master locking the door of his house, but people stood out and knocked and asked for entry. The master will disavow knowing them and bar them from entering. Others will come from afar and be admitted. Jesus ends the story by declaring, "Some who are last will be first, and some who are first will be last."

Sunday, August 28th (Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time)


First Reading from the Book of Sirach 3:17-18, 20, 28-29 - Be humble and you will be appreciated more than someone who gives gifts and boasts about it. You will find favor with God if you gladly give alms and atone for sins. Listen to the sayings of the wise and the proverbs of the sage. The greater you are, the more humble you should be.

Responsorsial Psalm Psalm 68:4-5, 6-7, 10-11 - "God, in your goodness, you have made a home for the poor."

Epistle Reading from Hebrews 12:18-19, 22-24 - Do not seek the darkness nor listen to voices speaking words of doom and gloom. Approach instead the city of God, the heavenly Jerusalem. There, God will be the judge of all and the just beings will be made perfect. Jesus is the judge of a new covenant. We should seek Him and thus be enrolled in heaven.

Gospel of Luke 14:1, 7-14 - When Jesus was dining on a Sabbath at the home of a Pharisee, He told them a parable of a wedding banquet. At the banquet, guests were choosing the highest places of honor at the table. Jesus said you should not push to be at the place of honor. If you do, a more distinguished guest will arrive and the host will tell you to give up your place to another and you will be embarrassed and take a lower place. Instead, take a lower place to begin and the host may come to you and tell you to take a higher place and you will enjoy the esteem. Jesus ended the parable with the well-know words: "Everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted." He then tells the Pharisee host that when he offers a meal, he should not invite those friends who will pay him back in kind. He should instead invite the poor and downtrodden who have no ability to repay him. That will show his righteousness.

HOLY FAMILY CATHOLIC CHURCH CHALLENGE FOR AUGUST

You've all heard of an "alpha dog" and maybe of "Omega watches." But these have nothing to do with the Book of Revelation. But those two words ("Alpha" and "Omega") do appear in Revelation as noted in 1:8, and are, in fact, Greek letters.

The Greek alphabet is composed of 24 letters: 14 consonants and 7 vowels. Besides our own five vowels, "E" and "O" have second vowels in the Greek alphabet for a different vowel sound than the other (Eta and Epsilon plus Omicron and Omega). If you place all 24 letters in "alphabetical" order (note: "alpha" and "beta" are the first two letters and hence our word "alphabet" is derived!), $A = \alpha \lambda \pi \eta \alpha$ (alpha) is the first letter and Ω = $O\mu\epsilon\gamma\alpha$ (omega) is the last letter.

This might give you a clue to the Lord proclaiming, "I am the Alpha and the Omega," the first and the last in creation, the eternal, who has always been and who always will be. During a dream, John was visited by the Lord in a vision, and what was revealed to him about Jesus and the heavenly kingdom John wrote and transcribed into what we know as the Book of Revelation or Apocalypse. During that vision, the Lord said to John, "I am the Alpha and the Omega."

The "Alpha" and "Omega" symbols appear frequently in liturgical art. Keep an eye out for the vestments worn by Father Fred and Deacon Victor; you might see the Greek letters A and Ω on their green stoles - the Alpha and the Omega!

TRANSFIGURATION



August 6th is the feast of the Transfiguration of Jesus. This miraculous apparition, which was experienced by Peter, James and John, is recorded in all three

Synoptic Gospels (Matthew, Mark and Luke). Jesus was on a mountain top with the three apostles when Jesus' garments became as dazzling as the sun, Moses and Elijah appeared with Him, and a voice from heaven proclaimed that Jesus was the chosen Son and all should hear Him. Needless to say, the apostles were fearful and amazed at what they had experienced. Read Luke's account (9:28-36), the account in Mark (9:2-10) or Matthew (17:1-9).
