SUNDAY MASS READINGS FOR SEPTEMBER**Sunday, August 28th (Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time)**

First Reading from the Book of Sirach 3:17-18, 20, 28-29 - Be humble and you will be appreciated more than someone who gives gifts and boasts about it. You will find favor with God if you gladly give alms and atone for your sins. Listen to the sayings of the wise and the proverbs of the sage. The greater you are, the more humble you should be.

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 68:4-5, 6-7, 10-11 - “God, in your goodness, you have made a home for the poor.”

Epistle Reading from Hebrews 12:18-19, 22-24 - Do not seek the darkness nor listen to voices speaking words of doom and gloom. Approach instead the City of God, the heavenly Jerusalem. There, God will be the judge of all and the just beings will be made perfect. Jesus is the judge of a new covenant. We should seek Him and thus be enrolled in heaven.

Gospel of Luke 14:1, 7-14 - When Jesus was dining on a Sabbath at the home of a Pharisee, He told them a parable of a wedding banquet. At the banquet, guests were choosing the highest places of honor at the table. Jesus said you should not push to be at the place of honor. If you do, a more distinguished guest will arrive and the host will tell you to give up your place to another and you will be embarrassed and take a lower place. Instead, take a lower place to begin and the host may come to you and tell you to take a higher place and you will enjoy the esteem. Jesus ended the parable with the well-know words: “Everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted.” He then tells the Pharisee host that when he offers a meal, he should not invite those friends who will pay him back in kind. He should instead invite the poor and downtrodden who have no ability to repay him. That will show his righteousness.

Sunday, September 4th (Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time)

First Reading from the Book of Wisdom 9:13-18 - We on earth know not the things of heaven. We are timid and unsure. The mind is weighed down with concerns; the body burdens the soul. Our paths on earth are made straight only because the Lord has given us wisdom and sent us Council and the Spirit.

Responsorial Psalm 90:3-4, 5-6, 12-13, 14 and 17 - “In every age, O Lord, you have been our refuge.”

Epistle Reading from Philemon 9-10, 12-17 - Paul writes to Philemon to urge him to accept Onesimus as the mouth-piece of Paul so that the word of the Lord is proclaimed and goodness will become voluntary and not forced.

Gospel of Luke 14:25-33 - Jesus challenges those who follow Him to love Him more than their families and to carry their cross if they are to be like Him. Renounce all possessions in order to truly follow Jesus.

Sunday, September 11th (Twenty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time)

First Reading from the Book of Exodus 14:25-33 - The Lord warned Moses that the people had made a statue of a calf to worship and had turned away from God. God was going to destroy the people but Moses pleaded with God to spare them and God relented and said He would not inflict punishment on the people if Moses convinced them to repent.

Responsorial Psalm Ps 51:3-4, 12-13, 17, 19 - “I will rise and go to my Father.”

Epistle Reading from the First Letter to Timothy 1:12-17 - The writer of this letter, Paul, proclaimed that the Lord Jesus appointed him to his ministry. He declared that he was once an arrogant persecutor but was acting out of ignorance. Jesus Christ came into the world to save sinners, and he was one of the foremost. He told that he was treated with mercy and patience by Jesus so that we might all know that He will bring everlasting life to those who repent and follow Him.

Gospel of Luke 15:1-32 - Jesus tells the parables of the “one lost sheep” and the “one lost coin” to show the Pharisees and Scribes that one lost soul will be sought after by God. He then tells the well-known parable of the Prodigal Son to show that anyone who is lost to God will be sought after, found, and brought back into the fold with full love and mercy.

CONTINUED SUNDAY MASS READINGS FOR SEPTEMBER

Sunday, September 18th (Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time)

First Reading from Amos 8:4-7 - A message from the prophet to those who trample upon the needy and attempt to destroy the poor. To those who cheat others in the way they sell their grain and swindle those they deal with. To them, the Lord will never forget what they have done. Woe to them!

Responsorial Psalm Ps 113:1-2, 4-6, 7-8 - "Praise the Lord who lifts up the poor."

Epistle Reading from the First Letter from Paul to Timothy - It is Paul's desire that all people pray daily without having any anger or resentment. All prayers and petitions should be offered up for everyone even including those in authority. Remember that Jesus is the mediator between God and us and that our prayers are heard and are pleasing to God.

Gospel of Luke 16:1-13 - Jesus tells the parable of the unfaithful steward who misused the master's property. The steward, when brought to account by the master, went to those who owed the master debts and offered to settle with them in a generous way so that the debtors would welcome the steward when he was let go by the master. Upon seeing this, the master commended the steward for acting prudently and showing mercy to others. Anyone who is faithful in small matters will turn around and be faithful in larger matters.

Sunday, September 25th (Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time)

First Reading from Amos 6:1, 4-7 - The Lord says woe to the complacent, woe to those who lay about listening to music and eating fine food and drink, who anoint themselves with oil without worrying about the collapse of those around them. They shall be the first to be banished and their lifestyle will be done away with.

Responsorial Psalm 146:7, 8-9, 9-10 - "Praise the Lord, my soul!"

Epistle Reading from the First Letter of Paul to Timothy 6:11-16 - Paul charges the people to obey the Commandments without hesitation and pursue righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience, and gentleness. God gives life to all.

Gospel of Luke 16:19-31 - Jesus tells the parable of the rich man and Lazarus the poor man (in terms of earthly riches). When both died, Lazarus was carried to heaven while the rich man was sent to the place of torment because he showed no mercy while on earth. When the rich man pleaded to have Lazarus give him a drink of cool water, Abraham refused. The rich man pleaded to send Lazarus to warn his brothers about the dangers of ignoring the poor, but Abraham told him that he had ignored the warning of the elders and prophets so why would his brothers heed the warning of Lazarus?

Sunday, October 2nd (Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time)

First Reading from the Book of Habakkuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4 - A plea to the Lord and a cry for help that seems to go unanswered. We are in misery and ruin and yet the Lord does not seem to intervene. So the Lord says to write down the vision of the future that does not disappoint. If the vision seems to delay in fulfillment, wait patiently. The rash one has no integrity; but the just one, because of his faith, shall live and the vision shall become a reality.

Responsorial Psalm 95:1-2, 6-7, 8-9 - "If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts."

Epistle Reading from Paul's Second Letter to Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14 - Bear your part of any hardship with the strength that comes from God. God did not give us cowardice but rather love and self-control. Take as your norm the words you heard from Paul that contain the faith and love from Jesus Christ Himself. Guard this trust with the help of the Holy Spirit.

Gospel of Luke 17:5-10 - Jesus said, "If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you would say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you." We should increase our faith and do all that is commanded of us.

CHALLENGE FOR SEPTEMBER

Our Catholic tradition talks about 9 different types of angels: Seraphim, Cherubim, Thrones, Dominions, Virtues, Powers, Principalities, Arch-angels, and Angels. In general, angels are pure spirits, created by God and sent as messengers from God to humans. Their existence is taken for granted from before the creation of the world. Different angels are mentioned in the Garden of Eden story and are referred to throughout scripture, appearing to people such as Lot, Abraham, Sarah, Joshua, Gideon, Jacob and Isaiah to guide them and comfort them.

Although there may be an unlimited number of angels in each of the above categories, we single out and name specific archangels who are mentioned in the bible:



Michael (Revelation 12:7, Jude 9), Gabriel (Luke 1:19, 26), and Raphael (Tobit 12:15). Each of these three had a role in bringing a message to people such as Tobit, Jospeh, and of course Mary at the Annunciation.

What about a fourth archangel? Who is it? Where do we read about this one? A fourth named archangel, Uriel, is mentioned in the *Book of Enoch*, which is a Hebrew religious text that pre-dates the time of Jesus, but which did not find its way into the canon of books referred to as the Old Testament or Hebrew Scripture. Within the Book of Enoch, the Archangel Uriel is sent by God to tell Noah of the coming cataclysm and what he needs to do.

Some local trivia: If you visit St. Basil Church in Vallejo, glance at the mural behind the altar that shows Christ seated on His throne in heaven with eight saints below Him. On the upper left of the mural is an image of the Archangel Michael and on the upper right is a depiction of the Archangel Uriel!
