Sunday, October 2nd (Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time)

First Reading from the Book of Habakkuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4 - A plea to the Lord and a cry for help that seems to go unanswered. We are in misery and ruin and yet the Lord does not seem to intervene. So the Lord says to write down the vision of the future that does not disappoint. If the vision seems to delay in fulfillment, wait patiently. The rash one has no integrity; but the just one, because of his faith, shall live and the vision shall become a reality.

Responsorsial Psalm 95:1-2, 6-7, 8-9 - "If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts."

Epistle Reading from Paul's Second Letter to Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14 - Bear your part of any hardship with the strength that comes from God. God did not give us cowardice but rather love and self-control. Take as your norm the words you heard from Paul that contain the faith and love from Jesus Christ Himself. Guard this trust with the help of the Holy Spirit.

Gospel of Luke 17:5-10 - Jesus said, "If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you would say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you." We should increase our faith and do all that is commanded of us.

Sunday, October 9th (Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time)

First Reading from the Second Book of Kings 5:14-17 - Naaman is cured of his leprosy through the word of Elisha who received his power to cure directly from God. Naaman told Elisha that he then believed that the God of Israel was the only true Lord and God.

Responsorsial Psalm 98:1, 2-3, 3-4 - "The Lord has revealed to the nations his saving power."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Second Letter to Timothy 2:8-13 - Paul says that he has suffered and been chained like a criminal because of his belief that Jesus Christ was raised from the dead. According to Paul, if we deny Christ, He will deny us. On the other hand, if we persevere in Him, we will reign with him and be saved.

Gospel of Luke 17:11-19 - As Jesus entered a village as he was passing through Galilee, ten lepers met Him and, standing at a distance asked Jesus to have mercy on them. Jesus told them to go show themselves to the high priest, and while they were on their way, they were cleansed of the leprosy. One - and one only - returned to Jesus and thanked Him and glorified Him. Jesus asked this one (who was actually a foreigner) where the other nine were who were also cleansed. He then told the one that his faith had saved him and he should go and lead a fruitful life.

Sunday, October 16th (Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time)

First Reading from the Book of Exodus 17:8-13 - Amalek waged war agains the Israelites bandits leaders Moses, Aaron and Joshua. When Moses stood on a hill overlooking the battle and held his staff above his head, the Israelites were successful in combating their enemy. But when Moses' arms grew tired and he dropped his staff, the Israelites began to lose. So Aaron and Hur supported Mosses' hands over his head, and they were victorious.

Responsorial Psalm 121:1-2, 3-4, 5-6, 7-8 - "Our help is from the Lord, who made heaven and earth."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Second Letter to Timothy 3:14–4:2 - Remain faithful to what you have learned, especially Scripture, which is inspired by God. Use Scripture to teach and train righteousness. Proclaim the Word. Encourage all through patience and teaching.

Gospel of Luke 18:1-8 - The parable of the steadfast judge: A widow continued to pester the judge to render her a rightful decision but the judge kept ignoring her. After much persistence, the judge finally relented so the widow would stop hounding him. Just like the widow, call out to God day and night and God will see that justice is done for you.

CONTINUED SUNDAY MASS READINGS FOR OCTOBER

Sunday, October 23rd (Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time)

First Reading from the Book of Sirach 35:12-14, 16-18 - The Lord is a God of Justice and hears the cry of the oppressed and the wail of the widow and orphan. The petition of the one who serves the Lord is heard by God. The prayer of even the lowly reaches heaven and the most high responds.

Responsorsial Psalm 34:2-3, 17-18, 19, 23 - "The Lord hears the cry of the poor."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Second Letter to Timothy 4:6-8, 16-18 - Paul says that the time for his departure is near, that he has run the race well, that the Lord stood by him and gave him strength. God will bring him safely to heaven.

Gospel of Luke 18:9-14 - The parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector: The prayer of the Pharisee was self-congratulatory for being so upright and righteous by praying and tithing and not being a sinner like the tax collector. The prayer of the tax collector on the other hand implored God to have mercy on him as he was a sinner. The message of the parable according to Jesus was that the latter went home justified, not the former; "for whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted."

Sunday, October 30th (Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time)

First Reading from the Book of Wisdom 11:22–12:2 - The Lord overlooks people's sins and shows mercy when they repent. The Lord cannot hate what He created. The Lord reminds us of our sins so we can abandon our wickedness and believe in the Lord.

Responsorsial Psalm 145:1-2, 8-9, 10-11, 13, 14 - "I will praise your name for ever, my king and my God."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Second Letter to the Thessalonians 1:11–2:2 - We pray to all of you that God may make you worthy of His calling. May the name of our Lord Jesus be glorified in you and you in Him. Do not be shaken when you hear that the day of the Lord is at hand.

Gospel of Luke 19:1-10 - The story of Zacchaeus, the chief tax collector, who wanted to catch a view of Jesus walking though town but was too short to see him because of the crowd. He ran to a tree and scaled it in order to see Jesus. When Jesus reached the tree, he called to Zacchaeus to come down out of the tree so that Jesus could accompany him to his house to stay overnight. The people grumbled because Jesus was going to the house of a sinner. When Zacchaeus heard this, he said to Jesus that if he had ever extorted money from the citizens, he would repay it and give it to the poor, to which Jesus replied, "Today salvation has come to this house . . . for the Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost."

HOLY FAMILY CATHOLIC CHURCH CHALLENGE FOR OCTOBER

Pope Francis is the first Jesuit to be named pope, the first pope from the Americas, the first pope from the Southern Hemisphere and the first pope from outside of Europe since the Eighth Century - almost 1300 years ago. Lots of firsts, eh? Well, he is also the first Pope to choose the papal name of Francis. We have recently had the pontificates of John Paul II (Poland) and Gregory XVI (Germany). Notice the Roman numerals after their papal names as there were prior popes with the same chosen surnames. Pope Francis, on the other hand, has no Roman numeral after his name - he is simply Pope Francis (the one and only up to now). This is the first time since 913 that a pope chose a name not used by a predecessor. If some future pope were to later select the papal name Francis, that person would become Pope Francis II.

But the original question was why did Cardinal Bergoglio choose the name Francis in the first place? The new pope - in his first papal proclamation - said he had chosen Francis because he was especially concerned for the well-being of the poor, as was St. Francis of Assisi. In his own words, the new pope said of St. Francis: "He brought to Christianity an idea of poverty against the luxury, pride, vanity of the civil and ecclesiastical powers of the time. He changed history." Many Catholic historians are saying that Pope Francis is himself changing history in more ways than one, such as by making a clear statement that we all need to love those less fortunate than ourselves and even those historically shunned by the Church - just as God loves them all.



And there was a second question: Why was this brought up this month? The answer to that one is easy: We celebrate the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi this month on October 4th. There's too much to try to

share right now about St. Francis (seen here), so you may want to look him up on the Internet and read about his life and ministry.
