SUNDAY MASS READINGS FOR NOVEMBER

Sunday, October 30th (Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time)

First Reading from the Book of Wisdom 11:22-12:2 - The Lord overlooks people's sins and shows mercy when they repent. The Lord cannot hate what He created. The Lord reminds us of our sins so we can abandon our wickedness and believe in the Lord.

Responsorsial Psalm 145:1-2, 8-9, 10-11, 13, 14 - "I will praise your name for ever, my king and my God."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Second Letter to the Thessalonians 1:11-2:2 - We pray to all of you that God may make you worthy of His calling. May the name of our Lord Jesus be glorified in you and you in Him. Do not be shaken when you hear that the day of the Lord is at hand.

Gospel of Luke 19:1-10 - The story of Zacchaeus, the chief tax collector, who wanted to catch a view of Jesus walking though town but was too short to see him because of the crowd. He ran to a tree and scaled it in order to see Jesus. When Jesus reached the tree, he called to Zacchaeus to come down out of the tree so that Jesus could accompany him to his house to stay overnight. The people grumbled because Jesus was going to the house of a sinner. When Zacchaeus heard this, he said to Jesus that if he had ever extorted money from the citizens, he would repay it and give it to the poor, to which Jesus replied, "Today salvation has come to this house . . . for the Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost."

Sunday, November 6th (Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time)

First Reading from 2 Maccabees 7:1-2, 9-14 - Seven brothers were arrested for refusing to break the law of their ancestors. Each one told their captors that they would rather die than break their religion's laws because the Lord will give them eternal life. Each one in order gave up their life so they would be raised up by God for eternity.

Responsorsial Psalm 17:1, 5-6, 8, 15 - "Lord, when your glory appears, my joy will be full."

Epistle Reading from Paul's Second Letter to the Thessalonians 2:16-3:5 - Through the grace of God, may the Lord encourage your hearts and strengthen every good deed your perform and every word you utter. The Lord, who is faithful, will strengthen you and guard you from all evil.

Gospel of Luke 20:27-38 - Some Sadducees, who denied that there will be a Resurrection, challenged Jesus with a hypothetical question about 7 brothers all dying and and asking Him whose husbands they would be after the Resurrection. The answer Jesus gave was that after the Resurrection, they will be dead no more, that they do not marry, and that they are children of God.

Sunday, November 13th (Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time)

First Reading from the Book of Malachi 3:19-20 - A day is coming when the evil doers and the proud will be set on fire and will burn like stubble. The others who fear the Lord will arise in the sun's rays and find justice for what they do in life.

Responsorsial Psalm 98:5-6, 7-8, 9 -"The Lord comes to rule the earth with justice."

Epistle Reading from Paul's Second Letter to the Thessalonians 3:7-12 - Imitate those of us who serve you. We do not burden you; we do not act in a disorderly way. Instead, we instructed you and demonstrated how willing we were to work for you and with you. Keep busy and work quietly. You will be rewarded.

Gospel of Luke 21:5-19 - After Jesus predicted the destruction of the temple, the people asked when that would happen and what signs they would see about its doom. Jesus said that there would be signs such as false prophets, wars and insurrections, earthquakes, famines, plagues, and persecutions. But because of your belief in the Lord, not a hair on your head will be harmed, and/or life will be secure.

CONTINUED SUNDAY MASS READINGS FOR NOVEMBER

Sunday, November 20th (Christ the King Sunday)

First Reading from the Second Book of Samuel 5:1-3 - Members of all the tribes of Israel approached David and reminded him that the Lord promised to raise David as commander in order to shepherd the people of Israel. With that, David made an agreement with the Lord and with the people who anointed David as their King.

Responsorial Psalm 122:1-2, 3-4, 4-5 - "Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord."

Epistle Reading from Paul's Letter to the Colossians 1:12-20 - Give thanks to the Father who delivered us from darkness and transferred us to the Kingdom of His Son. He created all things. He was before all things. He is the head of the Church. Through the blood of His son on the cross, He has reconciled all things.

Gospel of Luke 23:35-43 - While on the Cross, the rulers and soldiers jeered at Jesus saying that if he saved others, why can't he save himself? Even one of the two who was crucified with him reviled Jesus. But the other rebuked him, saying that the two of them were condemned justly, but that Jesus did nothing criminal and should not suffer the same fate of crucifixion. He then implored Jesus to remember him when He comes into His Kingdom. And Jesus told the man that today he would be in Paradise along with Jesus.

Sunday, November 27th (First Sunday of Advent)

First Reading from Isaiah 2:1-5 - A vision seen by Isaiah concerning a perfect nation built on principles of righteousness. There will be no more war. The word of the Lord will stream forth from Jerusalem. The House of Jacob will walk in the light of the Lord, and God's reign will come forth from the mountain top.

Responsorsial Psalm 122: 1-2, 3-4, 4-5, 6-7, 8-9 - "Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord."

Epistle Reading from Paul's Letter to the Romans 13:11-14 - Awake from your slumber. The time of the Lord's coming is near. Throw off your darkness and put on light. Conduct yourselves without debauchery, rivalry or jealousy. Make no provisions for actions of the flesh, but put on the Lord Jesus Christ.

Gospel of Matthew 24:37-44 - Jesus tells his followers that no one knew the day of the flood before Noah entered the ark. So too, no one knows the day that the Son of Man will return. When it happens, some will be taken and some will remain. So be watchful and stay awake. Jesus uses a parable: If the master of a house knew when a thief would come to break in, he would stay awake and stay vigilant and not let his house be broken into. So too, you must all be prepared, for you do not know when the Son of Man will come.

HOLY FAMILY CATHOLIC CHURCH CHALLENGE FOR NOVEMBER

When to bow:

√ From the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (or "GIRM") we read: "The Creed is recited by the priest together with the people with everyone standing. At the words et incarnatus est (by the power of the Holy Spirit . . . became man) all make a profound bow."

√ In 1274, Pope Gregory X expressing his desire that some physical gesture be done to honor the name of Jesus. St. Paul had written (Philippians 2:9-11) that at "the Name of Jesus let every knee be bent," and Pope Gregory wished that at the pronouncing of His Name, chiefly at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, every one would bow their head as a sign that they were interiorly bending the knee of their heart. Many Catholics now bow their heads at hearing the name of Jesus pronounced aloud - whether during Mass or outside the church.



√ Also found in the GIRM, one is supposed to genuflect whenever one passes before the Blessed Sacrament reposed within a tabernacle or to

give a bow of the body whenever one passes in front of the altar, as do the lectors, cantors, priest and deacon at the beginning of Mass.

√ The Church has taught that if you receive Communion standing, you should make a sign of reverence just before you receive, such as a deep bow or even the sign of the cross. What is suggested is some sign of reverence, and the choice is up to the communicant.

CORRECTION
