# SUNDAY MASS READINGS FOR DECEMBER

#### Sunday, November 27th (First Sunday of Advent)

**First Reading from Isaiah 2:1-5** - A vision seen by Isaiah concerning a perfect nation built on principles of righteousness. There will be no more war. The word of the Lord will stream forth from Jerusalem. The House of Jacob will walk in the light of the Lord, and God's reign will come forth from the mountain top.

Responsorsial Psalm 122: 1-2, 3-4, 4-5, 6-7, 8-9 - "Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord."

**Epistle Reading from Paul's Letter to the Romans 13:11-14 -** Awake from your slumber. The time of the Lord's coming is near. Throw off your darkness and put on light. Conduct yourselves without debauchery, rivalry or jealousy. Make no provisions for actions of the flesh, but put on the Lord Jesus Christ.

**Gospel of Matthew 24:37-44** - Jesus tells his followers that no one knew the day of the flood before Noah entered the ark. So too, no one knows the day that the Son of Man will return. When it happens, some will be taken and some will remain. So be watchful and stay awake. Jesus uses a parable: If the master of a house knew when a thief would come to break in, he would stay awake and stay vigilant and not let his house be broken into. So too, you must all be prepared, for you do not know when the Son of Man will come.

#### Sunday, December 4th (Second Sunday of Advent)

**First Reading from Isaiah 11:1-10** - A foretelling of the coming of the Messiah who shall bring peace to the world. He shall bring the spirit of wisdom and counsel and knowledge. The wolf shall lay down with the lamb, the cow and the bear shall be neighbors, and the child shall guide them. There will be no harm on the holy mountain. All will be glorious.

Responsorsial Psalm 72:1-2, 7-8, 12-13, 17 - "Justice shall flourish in his time, and fullness of peace for ever."

**Epistle Reading from Paul's Letter to the Romans 15:4-9 -** May you think in harmony with one another and may your voice speak in one accord to glorify the God and Father of our Lord, Jesus Christ. Welcome one another as Jesus welcomed you.

**Gospel of Matthew 3:1-12 -** The story of John the Baptist, the forerunner of Jesus, preaching in the wilderness, telling all to repent. John uses water to baptize in repentance but one coming after him will baptize with the Holy Spirit and fire.

#### Sunday, December 11th (Third Sunday of Advent)

**First Reading from Isaiah 35:1-6, 10 -** Those whom the Lord has ransomed will return in glory and everlasting joy. The Lord will come to save you. The eyes of the blind will see. The ears of the deaf will hear. The tongues of the mute will sing.

Responsorsial Psalm 146:6-7, 8-9, 9-10 - "Lord, come and save us."

**Epistle Reading from the Letter of James 5:7-10** - Be patient until the coming of the Lord. Be patient as does the farmer waiting for the crops. Do not complain about one another; if you do, you may be judged. Take as an example of hardship and patience, brothers and sisters, the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord.

**Gospel of Matthew 11:2-11 -** John the Baptist was in prison. When he heard that Jesus was preaching, he sent his disciples to ask if Jesus was the one who was destined to come after him. Jesus told John's followers to report back to John that the blind, lame, deaf and lepers were cured; and the poor had the good news preached to them. When they went off, Jesus continued to teach the crowds about John and the good that he did to prepare the way of the Lord.

#### Sunday, December 18th (Fourth Sunday of Advent)

**First Reading from Isaiah 7:10-14 -** The Lord will give the people a sign: a virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall name him Emmanuel.

Responsorsial Psalm 24:1-2, 3-4, 5-6. - "Let the Lord enter; He is king of glory."

**Epistle Reading from the Letter of Paul to the Romans 1:1-7 -** Through Jesus Christ's, Our Lord, we have become apostles of the Lord. We have been directed to bring the name of the Lord to the Gentiles and all the beloved in Rome. You are to be called holy; and thus, may the grace and peace of the Lord be with each of you.

**Gospel of Matthew 1:18-24 -** One portion of the story of the birth of Jesus, specifically the interplay between Joseph and the angel who explains to Joseph that Mary has conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and the child shall be named Jesus; and he will save His people from their sins.

#### Saturday, December 24th (Christmas Eve)

**First Reading from Isaiah 62:1-5 -** You shall be vindicated and kings shall call you a new name. Your land shall not be forsaken or desolate but your land will be a delight. The Lord will make your land His spouse.

Responsorsial Psalm 89:4-5, 16-17, 27, 29 - "For ever I will sing the goodness of the Lord."

**Epistle Reading from Acts 13:16-17, 22-25** - Paul tells those in Antioch that God had lifted up their ancestors and held them up when he led them out of Egypt. He removed Saul and lifted up David as their King. From David, God brought a savior to Israel. It was this Savior, Jesus, that John heralded, proclaiming a baptism of repentance. It was of Jesus that John proclaimed that one holier than he would be coming whom John would not be worthy of unfastening his sandals.

**Gospel of Matthew 1:1-25 -** The genealogy of Jesus from Abraham to Joseph through the House of David. This is followed by a repeat of the story of the birth of Jesus as told by Matthew in last Sunday's Gospel.

#### Sunday, December 25th (Christmas Day)

**First Reading from Isaiah 62:11-12 -** The Lord proclaims to the ends of the earth that a savior is coming. You shall be called holy people who have been redeemed by the Lord.

Responsorsial Psalm 97:1, 6, 11-12 - "A light will shine on us this day: the Lord is born for us."

**Epistle Reading from the Letter of Paul to Titus 3:4-7 -** Kindness and generous love from God comes to us not because of what we have done but because of the mercy of God. God has renewed us by sending us the Holy Spirit though Jesus Christ, our Savior. Thus we become heirs in the hope of eternal life.

**Gospel of Luke 2:15-20 -** When the angels left the shepherds, they said among themselves that they should go to Bethlehem to see what the Lord has made known to them. Thereupon, they found Mary and Joseph and the baby lying in a manger. The told all they encounterd what the angels had told them, which Mary kept in her heart; and the shepherds returned to their fields glorifying and praising God for all they had been told and all they had seen for themselves.

# HOLY FAMILY CATHOLIC CHURCH CHALLENGE FOR DECEMBER

Were you prepared for another trick question? The content of various Nativity pageants and Christmas plays are taken from the Gospels of Matthew and Luke and various other non-biblical traditions and some folklore about the birth of Jesus. But the Gospels of Mark and John have zero stories about Bethlehem and the nativity only Matthew and Luke do. Mark's Gospel begins with the public ministry of Jesus with His time in the desert followed by His baptism by John the Baptist in the Jordan. John's Gospel begins with a proclamation of the beginning of time and moves into the ministry of John the Baptist, followed by the ministry of Jesus.

As far as the birth of Jesus, Matthew stresses that part of the nativity story that concentrates on Joseph, the Magi and the flight to Egypt (see below), while Luke stresses the part that concentrates on Mary, the birth of John, and the shepherds. This year's scripture readings on the 24th and 25th are taken from Luke's Gospel, with one Mass using the beginning of Matthew and its genealogy leading up to Joseph.

A suggestion to each of you during this Christmas season: Spend some time reading the accounts of the birth of Christ using Matthew 1:18–2:23 and Luke 1:5–2:40.
