SUNDAY MASS READINGS FOR APRIL

Sunday, March 31st (Easter Sunday)

First Reading from the Acts of the Apostles 10:34, 37-43 - Peter proclaimed that he and the other apostles were all witnesses of what Jesus did throughout His public ministry, and that he had been commissioned to preach the Good News to all the people so that everyone who believes in Jesus will received forgiveness of sins.

Responsive Psalm 118:1-2, 16-17, 22-23 - "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Colossians 3:1-4 - As we all were raised with Christ, we should seek what is above, not what is on earth. We will appear with Christ in all His glory.

Gospel of John 20:1-9 - The story of Mary of Magdala going to the tub early in the morning and saw the stone removed from the tomb. She went in haste to find Peter and the apostle John, fearful that someone had taken Jesus' body from the tomb. When the three went back to the time, they looked in and saw the burial clothes set aside and the tomb otherwise empty. They did not fully understand that He had to rise, but they saw with their own eyes and believed.

Sunday, April 7th (Second Sunday of Eastertime - Divine Mercy Sunday)

A reading from Acts of the Apostles 4:32-35 - The community of believers took care of themselves. None was needy. All were taken care of and all bore witness to the Resurrection of Jesus. They were a true community.

Responsive Psalm 118:2-4,13-15,22-24 -"Give thanks to the LORD, for He is good, His love is everlasting."

Epistle Reading from the First Letter of John 5:1-6 - When we love God and obey His commandments, we also then love the children of God. Those begotten by God conquer the world. Those who believe in Jesus Christ become victors over the world. The Spirit testifies to Jesus and the Spirit is truth.

Gospel of John 20:19-31 - The day after His Resurrection, Jesus appeared to His disciples through a locked door and bestowed peace on them and showed them the nail marks. He imparted the Holy Spirit on them and told them to forgive the sins of those who confessed (establishing the sacrament of Confession or Reconciliation). As we know the story, the apostle Thomas was not present and doubted the story told to him by the others that they had seen the Lord. He wouldn't believe unless he saw for himself. A week later, Jesus appeared again and spoke directly to Thomas, showing him the nail marks. Thomas believed and exclaimed, "My Lord any\d my God."

Sunday, April 14th (Third Sunday of Eastertime)

A reading from Acts of the Apostles 3:13-15, 17-19 - Peter preached to the people, chiding them that they believed in Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, but did not believe in the Holy and Righteous One, putting Him to death. We are witnesses of His rising from the dead. Repent and be converted so your sins may be wiped away.

Responsive Psalm 4:2, 4, 7-9 - "Lord, let your face shine on us."

Epistle Reading from the First Letter of John 2:1-5 - Do not sin, but if you do, you have an advocate with the Father in the Lord Jesus Christ Himself. The way to know Him is to keep His commandments

Gospel of Luke 24:35-48 - Another post-Resurrection appearance by Jesus to his disciples. When Jesus spoke to the two disciples, they were afraid, thinking they were seeing a ghost. But Jesus showed them His hands and feet and asked them for something to eat. Jesus opened their minds about the scriptures of Moses and the prophets that had predicted the death and rising of the Messiah. He told them to preach in His name beginning in Jerusalem and spreading to the entire world. Preach repentance, He commanded them.

Sunday, April 21st (Fourth Sunday of Eastertime)

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles 4:8-12 - Peter continued his preaching to the people after healing a cripple. He reminded the people that the healing was in the name of Jesus the Nazorean whom they crucified, and whom God raised from the dead. He is the stone that the builders rejected. Only through Him is salvation.

Responsive Psalm 118: 1, 8-9, 21-23, 26, 28, 29 - "The stone rejected by the builders has become the cornerstone."

Epistle Reading from the First Letter of John 3:1-2 - God loves us so much that He calls us children of God. The world doesn't know us because it didn't know Him. We are God's children now but we will be so much more.

Gospel of John 10:11-18 - Jesus calls Himself the "Good Shepherd." A hireling does not protect the sheep because they are not his. Jesus knows those in His flock and would lay down his life for them - as he, in fact, did. Even those not in His fold will be protected by Him so there will be one fold and one shepherd.

Sunday, April 28th (Fifth Sunday of Eastertime)

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles 9:26-31 - When Saul (later called Paul) first arrived in Jerusalem to join other disciples, they were afraid of him, thinking that he really had not been converted by Jesus on the road. The disciple Barnabas convinced the others that Paul had indeed seen the Lord and was now speaking boldly in the name of Jesus. The church in Judea, Galilee and Samaria was growing in numbers as Paul preached to them.

Responsive Psalm 22:26-27, 28, 30, 31-32 - "I will praise you, Lord, in the assembly of your people."

Epistle Reading from the First Letter of John 3:18-24 - The love you show should not be just in word or speech, but should be in deed and truth. If we have confidence on God, we will receive from Him what we need because we keep His commandments and do what pleases Him. And what are the great commandments? We should believe in the name of His Son, Jesus Christ, and love one another has He commanded us.

Gospel of John 15:1-8 - Jesus spoke in a parable about vines, branches, and vine growers. Jesus said that He is the vine and we are the branches. If we remain in Him, we will bear much fruit. If we do not remain in Him, we will be thrown out like a withered branch. He told the people that His Father wishes them to bear much fruit and become His disciples. A branch cannot bear fruit if it is torn off the vine, so remain a part of the vine, which is Jesus. Apart from the vine, we, the branches, cannot continue to exist.



HOLY FAMILY CATHOLIC CHURCH CHALLENGE FOR APRIL

Let us first look at the challenge presented by the date of the Feast of the Annunciation, and then we will look at the historical and religious significance of the event as depicted in the art work below.

The Canon of the Catholic Church places the Feast of the Annunciation on March 25th (nine months to the day before we celebrate the birth of Jesus) EXCEPT when that date falls on a Sunday in Lent, during Holy Week (as it does this year), or during the octave of Easter (the week following Easter). In those instances, it is celebrated on the Monday after the first Sunday after Easter. This year, that occurs on April 8th.

The Annunciation is narrated in the Bible in the Book of Luke, Chapter 1, verses 26-38. Accord-ing to the Bible, the archangel Gabriel was sent to Mary, a virgin in Nazareth. Gabriel told her not to fear, that she had found grace with God from the point off her own conception. Not to be con-fused with this conception of Jesus, we celebrate that feature of Mary on the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, which takes place on December 8th - except again this year when that date will fall on a Sunday, and the Feast of the Immaculate Conception will be celebrated on Monday, December 9th.

Once again, at the Annunciation, Gabriel announced to Mary that she would conceive by the power of the Holy Spirit and would bear a Son, who would become the Savior of the world, the Messiah. Also know that the Annunciation is the first decade of the Joyful Mysteries of the rosary. Quite a special feast!
