

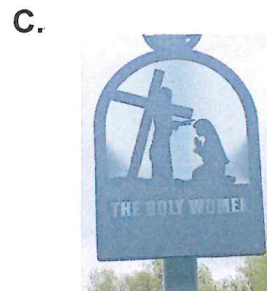
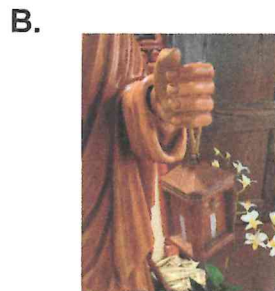
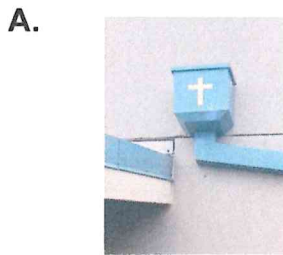

JUNE CHALLENGES

- A. This is one of four downspouts on the gutters of Holy Family Church on the north and south sides of the church building.
- B. This is a lantern being held by St. Joseph as part of the large carved wooden statue of the Holy Family in the front left corner of the church. Currently, the child Jesus is standing between Mary and Joseph, but have you noticed that during Christmastide baby Jesus is being held in Mary's arms?
- C. This is one of the outdoor plaques which is part of our Stations of the Cross. This is Station VIII (The Holy Women) located on a pole on the east side of the parking lot. Have you prayerfully walked all 14 Stations? You can do it at any time!
- D. This is the license plate of the vehicle you'll see parked in the pastor's parking space. Thanks to the generosity of a family in the parish, Fr. Fred is able to use this vehicle as he makes his ministerial rounds around the parish. Thanks to their benevolence.
- E. This "peace" rock is part of the rock garden around the statue of the Blessed Mother located in the northwest corner of the property outside the courtyard.
- F. This donation bottle is location in the foyer of the church and is labeled "Loose change jar to benefit building of church. Thank you." You are always welcomed to drop your coins (and even bills) into the jar to contribute to our **Pay Off the Loan Fund**.
- G. Trick question! This is the statue of Moses sculpted by Michelangelo in 1505 which is found in the Basilica of San Pietro in Vincoli (St. Peter in Chains) in Rome - not at Holy Family! Have you been there? If not, hopefully you will make it to Rome one day (and to the Vatican and its surrounding religious sites).



SUNDAY MASS READINGS FOR JUNE

Sunday, May 31st (Feast of the Holy Trinity)

A reading from Exodus 34:4-6, 8-9 - Moses went up Mount Sinai as the Lord had commanded him and took with him the tablets of the law. The Lord stood there with Moses and he bowed down in worship. Moses begged the Lord to pardon the wickedness and sinfulness of the people, and asked the Lord to receive the people as His own.

Responsive Reading from Daniel 3:52, 53, 54, 55, 56 - "Glory and praise for ever!"

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Second Letter to the Corinthians 13:11-13 - Paul exhorts the people to live in peace, mend their ways and agree with one another. In that way, the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with them all.

Gospel of John 3:16-18 - This is the well-known verse we hear often: "God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." God did not send His Son into the world to condemn it but that the world would be saved through Him

Sunday, June 7th (Feast of Corpus Christi - the Holy Body and Blood of Christ)

A reading from Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14-16 - Moses reminded the people that they have journeyed through the desert for forty years and that the Lord had tested them to determine whether it was the people's intention to keep His commandments. He challenged them with hunger and gave them food. In the end, He brought them out of slavery in Egypt and guided them into the Promised Land.

Responsive Psalm 147:12-13, 14-15, 19-20 - "Praise the Lord, Jerusalem."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians 10:16-17 - Paul asks the people: Is not the cup of blessing that they bless the blood of Christ? Is not the bread that they break a participation in the body of Christ? We, though, many, all partake in the one loaf.

Gospel of John 6:51-58 - Jesus said to the crowds that He is the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats that bread will last forever. Whoever eats His flesh and drinks His blood will remain in Him and He will remain in them.

Sunday, June 14th (11th Sunday in Ordinary Time)

A reading from Exodus 19:2-6 - While the Israelites were in the desert of Sinai, Moses went up to a high mountain and encountered God. The Lord told him to tell the people that they should listen to His voice and keep His covenant. In that way, they will become a holy nation.

Responsive Psalm 100:1-2, 3, 5 - "We are his people: the sheep of his flock."

Epistle Reading from the Letter of St. Paul to the Romans 5:6-11 - Paul said that God proved His love for us while we were still sinners by sending Christ who died for us. We have been reconciled to God through the death of His Son and we will be saved by the life of Christ.

Gospel of Matthew 9:36—10:8 - Jesus' heart was moved to pity at the sight of the crowds who were like sheep without a shepherd. Jesus sent out His Apostles to be shepherds and to act as laborers in a harvest. He sent them out to the lost sheep of Israel to cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, and drive out demons. They should tell the people that the kingdom of heaven is at hand.

Sunday, June 21st (12th Sunday in Ordinary Time)

A reading from Jeremiah 20:10-13 - Jeremiah the Prophet indicates that his friends have left him, but that the Lord is with him always and will smite his enemies. Always sing praise to the Lord and He will prevail.

Responsive Psalm Psalm 69:8-10, 14, 17, 33-35 - "Lord, in your great love, answer me."

Epistle Reading from the Letter of St. Paul to the Romans 5:12-15 - Sin and death came into the world because of one man and reigns over us all. But because of one man, Jesus Christ, sin and death have been removed and the Lord's gift of His Son overflows for the many.

Gospel of Matthew 10:26-33 - Jesus spoke to the Twelve: Do not be afraid of anyone who tries to kill the body, for they cannot kill the soul. The hairs on your head are counted and you are known personally by God. Anyone who acknowledges me, I will acknowledge before my heavenly Father. But whoever denies me, I will deny before my heavenly Father.

Sunday, June 28th (13th Sunday in Ordinary Time)

A reading from 2 Kings 4:8-11, 14-16 - During Elisha's travels, he met a kind women who, with her husband, gave him food and a place of lodging. Elisha wanted to do something in return for her, and when he found out that the couple was childless, he called the woman and told her that by that time next year, she will have borne a baby son.

Responsive Psalm Psalm 89:2-3, 16-17, 18-19 - "Forever I will sing the goodness of the Lord."

Epistle Reading from the Letter of St. Paul to the Romans 6:3-4, 8-11 - We who were baptized into Christ Jesus have also been baptized into His death. As Christ was raised from the dead, we also will be raised and can die no more. Be dead to sin and live for God in Jesus Christ.

Gospel of Matthew 10:37-42 - Jesus said to his Apostles that they must love Him even more than they love their parents or their children. They must take up their cross and follow Him. All should receive the word of prophets and welcome those who are righteous. All should give water to those who are thirsty even the little children because you will surely not lose your reward.
