## SUNDAY MASS READINGS FOR MAY

-----

#### Sunday, May 7 (Fifth Sunday of Eastertide)

**First Reading from Acts of the Apostles 6:1-7:** After complaints that widows were being neglected in daily distributions, the Twelve decided to select seven reputable men to lay hands on and make them special ministers. The Twelve prayed and laid hands on them and they continued to spread the faith and serve the widows.

Responsive Psalm 33:1-2, 4-5, 18-19: "Lord, let your mercy be on us, as we place our trust in you."

**Epistle Reading from the First Letter of Peter 2:4-9:** Those who are serving in the holy priesthood for the community of faith are to offer sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. The community is a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation and are called out of darkness into the light of Christ.

**Gospel of John 14:1-12:** Jesus told His disciples that He would prepare a place for them in heaven. When Thomas questioned Him, Jesus said that He is the way and the truth and the life, and all will come to the Father through Him. Jesus then told Philip that the Father dwells in Him and He in the Father, to whom Jesus is going.

#### Sunday, May 14 (Sixth Sunday of Eastertide)

**First Reading from Acts of the Apostles 8:5-8, 14-17:** In spreading the Word of Jesus, Philip went to Samaria. Samaria had accepted the word of God and many were baptized; so the apostles in Jerusalem also send Peter and John to teach them further and then lay hands on them so that they too might receive the Holy Spirit.

Responsive Psalm 66:1-3, 4-5, 6-7, 16, 20: "Let all the earth cry out to God with joy."

**Epistle Reading from the First Letter of Peter 3:15-18:** Sanctify Christ in your hearts. be gentle and give reverence to those who ask you for explanations. If you are maligned, know that is is better to suffer for doing good than for doing evil. Even Christ suffered for our sins and was brought to life in the Spirit.

**Gospel of John 14:15-21:** Jesus told His disciples, if you love me, you will keep my commandments. If you do, I will ask the Father to send you an Advocate to be with you always. Remember, whoever loves me will be loved by my Father.

## Sunday, May 21 (The Ascension of the Lord celebrated on the Seventh Sunday of Eastertide)

**First Reading from Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11:** The beginning of Luke's account of the Christian community following the Ascension. The Acts of the Apostles begins by recounting what Jesus taught the Apostles, how He answered their questions, how He appeared to them following His Resurrection, how He predicted the descent of the Holy Spirit, and how He gathered the Apostles together and rose to heaven.

Responsive Psalm 47:2-3, 6-7, 8-9: "God mounts his throne to shouts of joy: a blare of trumpets for the Lord."

**Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Ephesians 1:17-23:** Paul prays that the God of Glory will give them revelations, wisdom and knowledge. Know that Jesus was raised from the dead and sits at the Right Hand of the Father and was given power over all creation.

**Gospel of Matthew 28:16-20:** The Eleven went to the mountain near Galilee as Jesus had instructed them. There, Jesus appeared to them and told them to go to all nations and baptize them and teach them to observe all that Jesus taught and commanded. Jesus promised that He would be with them until the end of time. He then left them.

## Sunday, May 28 (Pentecost Sunday)

**First Reading from Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11:** Ten days after the Resurrection, the Apostles were gather in one place. And a strong driving wind filled the house they were in. There appeared tongues of fire that rested on the heads of each and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit. They began to speak in different languages as the Spirit led them. Outside, people from dozens of regions and from different countries heard the Apostles speaking, each in their own language.

Responsive Psalm 104:1, 24, 29-30, 31, 34: "Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth."

**Epistle Reading from St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians 12:3-7, 12-13:** There are different kinds of gifts given to all of us, but they all come from the same Spirit. As the body is one with many parts, so also is Christ. In one Spirit we were all baptized into one body; we were all given to drink of one Spirit.

**Gospel of John 20:19-23:** On the first day of the week, the disciples were gathered in one room, and Jesus came and stood in their midst. He said, "Peace be with you." When He showed them His hands and side, the disciples were overjoyed. Again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." Jesus then initiated the Sacrament of Reconciliation or Penance by telling the Disciples that "Whose sins they forgive are forgiven" but "Whose sins they retain are retained."



# MAY: THE MONTH OF MARY

The month of May is dedicated yearly to Mary. Plus, notice that on May 13th, the Church celebrates the Feast of Our Lady of Fatima. The multiple apparitions of Mary to the three children in Fatima, Portugal, began monthly on May 13, 1917, and were accompanied by the Marian instruction to pray the Rosary daily in honor of Our Lady of the Rosary to obtain peace and end World War I. We

## HOLY FAMILY CATHOLIC CHURCH CHALLENGE FOR MAY

Many numbers found in the bible are more symbolic than literal. As for the number 40 (this month's challenge), in Hebrew custom it symbolizes the length of time for testing, trial and judgment. Here are some of the uses of the number **40** in the Hebrew Scriptures: † Moses lived in Pharaoh's household for 40 years † Moses fasted for 40 days before he received the Ten Commandments † The Israelites wandered in the desert for 40 years † Elijah also fasted for 40 days † Goliath taunted the Israelites for 40 days † Saul, David and Solomon each ruled for exactly 40 years † Noah lasted on the ark for 40 days during the great flood † Nineveh was given 40 days by Jonah to repent †

And here is the number 40 found in the New Testament: † Jesus spent 40 days in the desert after His baptism and before His public ministry † there are **40** days from the Resurrection (Easter) to the Ascension (May 18 this year). And don't forget that we now assign 40 days to Lent. So, are all of these literal or are some figurative or symbolic about testing and trials? Think about it!

Extra Credit: 10 days after the Resurrection, the Church celebrates Pentecost. The descent of the Holy Spirit occurred 10 days after Jesus rose to heaven. This day is always celebrated 50 days after Easter. The word **Pentecost** comes from the Latin word pentecoste meaning "the fiftieth!"
