Greetings to you all. We are all blessed that Our Father God has graciously brought us to another new month. My prayers are always with you. May God protect you all.



SUNDAY MASS READINGS FOR JUNE

Sunday, May 28 (Pentecost Sunday)

First Reading from Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11: Ten days after the Resurrection, the Apostles were gathered in one place. And a strong driving wind filled the house they were in. There appeared tongues of fire that rested on the heads of each and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit. They began to speak in different languages as the Spirit led them. Outside, people from dozens of regions and from different countries heard the Apostles speaking, each in their own language.

Responsive Psalm 104:1, 24, 29-30, 31, 34: "Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians 12:3-7, 12-13: There are different kinds of gifts given to all of us, but they all come from the same Spirit. As the body is one with many parts, so also is Christ. In one Spirit we were all baptized into one body; we were all given to drink of one Spirit.

Gospel of John 20:19-23: On the first day of the week, the disciples were gathered in one room, and Jesus came and stood in their midst. He said, "Peace be with you." When He showed them His hands and side, the disciples were overjoyed. Again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." Jesus then initiated the Sacrament of Reconciliation or Penance by telling the Disciples that "Whose sins they forgive are forgiven" but "Whose sins they retain are retained."

Sunday, June 4th (The Most Holy Trinity)

First Reading from Exodus 34:4-6, 8-9: Moses ascended Mount Sinai with the two tablets and had another encounter with the Lord. Moses bowed down to the ground in worship and prayed that God would pardon the wickedness and sins of the people and receive them as children of God.

Responsive Reading from Deuteronomy 3:52, 53, 54, 55, 56: "Glory and praise for ever!"

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Second Letter to the Corinthians 13:11-13: The grace and love of the Lord is with all. The people must mend their ways and live in peace and love one another.

Gospel of John 3:16-18: This is the Gospel that begins with the oft-seen scripture quote at football games: "God so loved the world that he sent his only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him might not parish." God sent His Son so that the world might be saved through Him. Believe in Him and you will not be condemned.

Sunday, June 11th (Body and Blood of Christ)

First Reading from Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14-16: Moses tells the people that for forty years, God has directed their journey through the desert. He has tested them with hunger but then fed them manna. He led them out of slavery in Egypt and when they became thirsty in the desert, he provided them with water.

Responsive Psalm 147:12-13, 14-15, 19-20: "Praise the Lord, Jerusalem."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians 10:16-17: We all participate in the cup of blessing and partake of one loaf. The cup is our participation in the blood of Christ and the bread that we break is a participation in the body of Christ.

Gospel of John 6:51-58: Jesus told the crowds that he was the living bread that came down from heaven. The bread that He gives is His flesh for the life of the world. The crowd objected asking how this man can give us His flesh to eat. Jesus replied that unless we eat of His Flesh and drink of His blood, we will not have eternal life in us. Unlike the ancestors who ate the bread of manna and died, we will eat this brad and live forever.

Sunday, June 18th (Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time)

First Reading from Exodus 19:2-6: Moses again went up onto Mount Sinai and had another encounter with God. The Lord reminded Moses how He saved the people from Egypt and bore them up "on eagle wings." The people should harken to God's voice and keep His covenant and they will be considered a holy nation.

Responsive Psalm 100:1-2, 3, 5: "We are his people: the sheep of his flock."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Romans 5:6-11: God prove His love for us in that while we were sinners, Christ died for us. Now that we are reconciled to God, how much more will we be saved? We have received reconciliation with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.

Gospel of Matthew 9:36—10:8: This is Matthew's version of the naming of the twelve apostles. He sent these twelve out as laborers of His harvest. He sent them to find the lost sheep of Israel. He gave the apostles authority over unclean spirits, and the power to cure the sick, raise the dead and cleanse lepers.

Sunday, June 25th (Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time)

First Reading from Jeremiah 20:10-13: Jeremiah lamented that those who used to be his allies were now trying to trap him and find any misdeeds he might perform. Fortunately, Jeremiah proclaims, the Lord is with him and his persecutors cannot triumph. The Lord has rescued the life of the poor from the power of the wicked.

Responsive Psalm 69:8-10, 14, 17, 33-35: "Lord, in your great love, answer me."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Romans 5:12-15: Through one man, sin came into the world, and through sin, death came also to all people since all have sinned. Death reigned from Adam to Moses. But from the grace of God and the gracious gift of Jesus Christ, life may now overflow for all people who believe.

Gospel of Matthew 10:26-33: Jesus told His apostles not to be afraid of those who might kill the body for they cannot kill the soul. So do not be afraid. You are worth more to God than many sparrows who are offered to God as sacrifices. Jesus says, "Whoever acknowledges Me, I will acknowledge before my heavenly Father. But whoever denies Me before others, I will deny them before my Father."

Sunday, July 2nd (Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time)

First Reading from the Second Book of Kings 4:8-11, 14-16: The prophet Elisha was welcomed by a woman who invited him to dine with her and her husband. She arranged a room for him with a bed and other amenities; so Elisha was able to stay with her. Elisha asked his servant if there was something he could do for the woman and the servant told him that the woman was without a son and the husband was getting along in years. Alisha called the woman and promised her that in one year, she would deliver a baby son.

Responsive Psalm 89:2-3, 16-17, 18-19: "For ever I will sing the goodness of the Lord."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Romans 6:3-4, 8-11: Paul tells the Christians of Rome that they were baptized into Christ Jesus and also share in His death. They were buried, but just as Christ was raised from the dead, so too will they be given a newness of life by the glory of the Father. The people should think of themselves as dead to sin and living for God in Christ Jesus.

Gospel of Matthew 10:37-42: Jesus tells his apostles that if they don't take up their cross and follow Him, they are not worthy of Him. Whoever finds his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for the sake of Jesus will find it. Jesus says, "Whoever receives you receives me, and whoever receives me receives the one who sent me." Jesus tells them that whoever gives even a cup of water to someone who is thirsty will not lose his reward in heaven.

Check with your Religious Education teachers for more details about registration.


The Knights Of Columbus Council 15750 will

It has been 38 years of our life and mission. In that time, the vision that God gave us has continued to evolve. In 1981 we saw the establishment of Couples for Christ (CFC). In 1993 we saw its refounding. In 2007 we saw its restoration, then as CFC-FFL (Foundation for Family Life).

Now, In response to the Spirit's prophetic call for our community, in accordance with the evolution of God's design, we have changed our name. We are now *Missionary Families of Christ*. (MFC)

The Holy Family MFC group provides the choir, readers and EMs at 5:15 Masses and meets to solidify the group's core values: Christ centered, focused on the family, being community, serving the church and living a preferential option for the poor. Contact Frank or Bonnie Lee for more info.

CHALLENGE FOR JUNE

The one feast [out of the four] that will NOT be celebrated during June is the Feast of Christ the King (of the Universe), which is always celebrated on the last Sunday of the Liturgical year. This is either the last or second-to-the-last Sunday of November. The Sunday after Christ the King is the First Sunday of Advent, which begins the new Church liturgical year. The other three are, in fact, celebrated during June of this year:

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity is always celebrated on the first Sunday after Pentecost (June 4th this year). The dogma of faith which forms the object of this feast is this: There is one God and in this one God there are three Divine Persons; the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God. Yet there are not three Gods, but one, eternal, incomprehensible God! We are reminded that no mortal can fully fathom this sublime truth, but believe it on faith.

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (June 11th this year) is always celebrated on the second Sunday after Pentecost, and has been know for centuries by its Latin name as the Feast of *Corpus Christi* (the Body of Christ.) The feast celebrates the Blessed Sacrament, confirming the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist—Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity.

The Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus – also the World Day of Prayer for the Sanctification of Priests – is celebrated on the Friday after the Solemnity of *Corpus Christi* (June 16th this year). This suggests to us that the Eucharist (*Corpus Christi*) is none other than the Heart of Jesus himself, of the One who "takes care of us" with his "heart". In 1995, Saint John Paul II instituted the World Day of Prayer for the Sanctification of Priests on this same day so that the priesthood might be protected in the hands and heart of Jesus.
