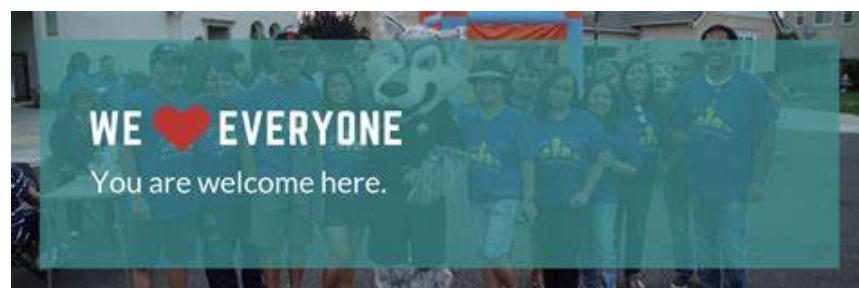
### CHALLENGES FOR NOVEMBER

# SUNDAY MASS READINGS FOR NOVEMBER

**Sunday, October 29th (Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time)**

**First Reading from the Book of Exodus 22:20-26** - The Lord instructs the Israelites not to oppress an alien and not to do any harm to orphans or widows. The Lord will hear the cries of those who are abused and His wrath will be shown. Similarly, do not extort money from your neighbor, and if you take his cloak as a pledge, return it before sundown for he has nothing else to sleep in. The Lord says that He hears all and is compassionate to all.

**Responsive Psalm 18:2-3, 3-4, 47, 51** - "I love you, Lord, my strength.

**Epistle Reading from St. Paul's First Letter to the Thessalonians 1:5-10** - Paul reminds the people that they became imitators of Paul when he was among them. And they spread the word of the Lord throughout the area. He commends the people for turning from idols to serve the true God and to await for the return of Jesus from heaven.

**Gospel of Matthew 22:34-40** - The Pharisees continued to test Jesus by asking Him which was the greatest commandment? Jesus said that we should all love the Lord, our God, with all our heart and soul and mind. And that the second greatest is like the first that we should love our neighbor as ourself. Jesus said that "the whole law and the prophets depends on these two commandments."

**Sunday, November 5th (31st Sunday in Ordinary Time)**

**First Reading from Malachi 1:14-2:2, 8-10** - The Lord says He is King, and all priests of the people must give glory to His name. He accuses the priests of turning away and causing the people to falter by bad instruction. We have one father and one God has created us but shame when you break the covenant made with your fathers.

**Responsive Psalm 131:1, 2, 3** - "In you, Lord, I have found my peace."

**Epistle Reading from St. Paul's First Letter to the Thessalonians 2:7-9, 13** - Paul tells the people that he cares for them as a mother cares for her children. He proclaimed to the people the Gospel of God and he gives thanks to God on behalf of all those who believe.

**Gospel of Matthew 23:1-12** - Jesus told the crowds that the Scribes and the Pharisees preach but they do not practice. So listen to them but do not follow their example. They act only to be seen and try to be better than the people. They are hypocrites. "Whoever exalts himself will be humbled; whoever humbles himself will be exalted."

**Sunday, November 12th (32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time)**

**First Reading from the Book of Wisdom 6:12-16** - Wisdom is unfading. Whoever watches for her will not be disappointed. Whoever keeps vigil waiting for wisdom will be free from care and concern. Wisdom seeks those who are worthy of her and appears to them in many ways, granting them solicitude.

**Responsive Psalm 63:2, 3-4, 5-6, 7-8** - "My soul is thirsting for you, O Lord my God."

**Epistle Reading from Paul's First Letter to the Thessalonians 4:13-18** - We truly believe that Jesus died but rose. So too, He will take with him all those who have fallen asleep, for those who have died in Christ will rise first. Console one another when our dear ones are departed, for they shall always be with the Lord.

**Gospel of Matthew 25:1-13** - Jesus taught using parables. This is the parable of the ten virgins, five who were foolish but five who were wise. When they all went to meet the bridegroom, the foolish ones did not take any oil with them, but the wise ones took flasks of oil. Thus when the bridegroom actually arrived late at night, the ones without oil begged the other to give them oil, but the wise ones refused for fear that they all would then lack oil. Those who were ready went into the wedding feast; but the others were left out in the cold.

Sunday, November 19th (Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time)

**First Reading from the Book of Proverbs 31:10-13, 19-20, 30-31** - A worthy wife is a pearl beyond compare. She brings her husband good. She works with loving hands. She reaches out to the poor and needy. She should be praised. She should be rewarded for her labors and her works will be praised in heaven.

**Responsive Psalm 128:1-2, 3, 4-5** - “Blessed are those who fear the Lord.”

**Epistle Reading from Paul’s First Letter to the Thessalonians 5:1-6** - You know that the day of the Lord will come like a thief at night. But you are not in darkness for you are all children of the light. We are not people of the darkness but of the light. So stay alert.

**Gospel of Matthew 25:14-30** - Another parable from Jesus; this the parable of the talents. A man goes on a journey and gives his various servants various amounts of money to invest wisely. Those who invested returned the amount plus interest to the master and were rewarded with greater responsibilities and greater benefits. But one servant who kept his amount and buried it returned it to the master without any profit and was chided by the master as being lazy and stubborn. The moral was that to everyone who has, more will be given and he will grow rich; but from the one who has not, even what he has will be taken away.

Sunday, November 26th (Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe)

**First Reading from Ezekiel 34:11-12, 15-17** - The Lord says that He will tend to His sheep as a shepherd tends to his flock. He will seek out the lost sheep and the strays. He will give them rest. He will heal the injured and sick.

**Responsive Psalm 23:1-2, 2-3, 5-6** - “The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want.”

**Epistle Reading from St. Paul’s First Letter to the Corinthians 15:20-26, 28** - Paul reminds the people that Christ was raised from the dead. Just as in Adam, all people die, so too in Christ all shall be brought to life. Christ will put all His enemies under His feet and they shall be destroyed. When this happens, all will live in God.

**Gospel of Matthew 25:31-46** - The well-known parable of the king who separated the sheep from the goats, putting the sheep on one side and the goats on at the other. He says to those on his right that when he was hungry, they fed him, thirsty and they have him drink, naked and clothed him, sick or in prison and they visited him. The righteous will say that they never saw the king in those conditions, and the king responds that whenever they did those things to the least of his brothers and sisters, it was like they were doing it to him. He then says to those on his left that they refused to minister to him, saying, when you failed to do these to the least of my brothers and sisters, you failed to do it for me. And he sent those on his left off to eternal punishment.

Sunday, December 3rd (First Sunday in Advent)

**First Reading from the Book of Isaiah 63:16-17, 19; 64:2-7** - A prayer to God that He not let us flounder. We are sinful and withered like leaves, but we wait for God to do great deeds for us. “We are the clay and you, O God, are the potter. We are the works of your hands.”

**Responsive Psalm 80:2-3, 15-16, 18-19** - “Lord, make us turn to you; let us see your face and we shall be saved.”

**Epistle Reading from St. Paul’s First Letter to the Corinthians 1:3-9** - Paul tells the people that the grace of God has been bestowed on them, that they have been enriched, and that they are not lacking in spiritual gifts. They should wait for the revelation of Jesus Christ knowing that God will keep them firm to the end. Know that God is faithful and calls us into fellowship with His Son, Jesus Christ.

**Gospel of Mark 13:33-37** - Jesus told His disciples to be watchful and be alert. We are like the servant whose master has gone on a trip and we are told to keep the property safe, for we do not know when the master will return. He may come home early and find us asleep. Jesus tells them to stay alert and be watchful.

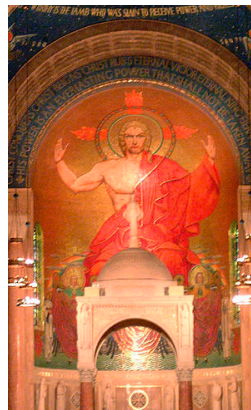
**LECTOR SCHEDULES**

All Saints Day was formally established by Pope Gregory in the **9th century** to be celebrated by the whole Church as a day to remember and celebrate all known (and unknown) saints whom we are assured are in heaven and experiencing the beatific vision of God. He set the date to be November 1st of each year.



All Souls Day on the other hand was established later - in the **10th century** by St. Odilo of Cluny to remember (and pray for) all the faithfully departed who may still be in purgatory awaiting the full beatific vision in heaven. The date was set for November 2nd, the day after All Saints Day.

And much more recently, the Feast of Christ the King of the Universe was established by Pope Pius XI in **1925**. It is celebrated each year on the last Sunday of the liturgical year - the Sunday before Advent begins. The Church anticipates Christ's coming as Ruler and King. The photo to the right is of a huge mosaic above the altar at the Basilica of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D.C., depicting Jesus as the sovereign monarch ruling over the world.



While the concept of Daylight Savings Time may have been proposed by Benjamin Franklin in the 1780s, it was not formally adopted in the U.S. until 1918 during WWI and again during WWII to give more daylight hours to workers in military construction factories. It was made permanent in **1966**, and the ending date was later shifted from the last Sunday in October to the Sunday after Halloween to make sure more daylight was still available for trick-or-treaters.

Election day was chosen by the U.S. Congress way back in **1845** to be the Tuesday after harvest had been completed (which happened in November). In those days, people had to travel to the county seat in order to vote. Thus, people would finish the harvest, go to church on Sunday, travel to the voting site on Monday, vote on Tuesday, and return home on Wednesday. Thus, the first Tuesday in November has been voting day going back well over a hundred years.

Veterans' Day actually began with a different name: In 1918 on the 11th day of the 11th month at 11AM, an agreement was signed by all parties involved in Europe to end World War I. Thus, 11/11 became the American holiday of Armistice Day. In **1954**, its name was changed to Veterans Day to pay tribute to all veterans of military service, whether during war time or peace time.
