HOLY FAMILY PRAYER





THE MONTH OF EPIPHANY

Be sure to open your bible and read from the Gospel according to Matthew, Chapter 2, Verses 1-12, to read the story of the "Wise Men" or astrologers who had an "epiphany" (or manifestation, showing forth, appearance or



revelation) in the form of a divine star leading them to Jerusalem and then to Bethlehem where they found the Christ Child and paid Him homage and showered Him with gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Be careful not to read too much into the story beyond what is recorded in the Gospel - nativity plays and songs tend to embellish the story with added details that unfortunately have become more of a myth than fact. Epiphany = January 6th.

Sunday, December 31st (Feast of the Holy Family)

First Reading from the Book of Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14 - Fathers honor their children and mothers confirm authority over them. Those children who revere their fathers will live a long life, which brings comfort to their mothers. All should take care of their parents when they turn old; kindness to elders will not be forgotten.

Responsive Psalm 128:1-2, 3, 4-5 - "Blessed are those who fear the Lord and walk in his ways."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Colossians 3:12-21 - We are God's chosen ones and should put on compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience. Bear with one another and forgive one another. Husbands and wives should respect one another and love one another, and children should please the family.

Gospel of Luke 2:22-40 - The story of Mary and Joseph taking the infant Jesus to Jerusalem to present Him to the Lord. In the temple, Simeon recognized the infant as divine and told Mary that the child was destined for the rise and fall of many in Israel, and that Mary would have her own heart pierced because of her son. Another prophetess in the temple, Anna, gave thanks to God for her having seen the child who will redeem Jerusalem. The Holy Family then returned to Galilee, to their own hometown of Nazareth, and the child Jesus grew and became filled with wisdom, and the favor of God was upon Him.

Sunday, January 7th (Feast of the Epiphany)

First Reading from the Book of Isaiah 60:1-6 - A light will rise up over Jerusalem. The Lord's radiance will reign over all nations. Caravans of camels will come from afar bearing gold and frankincense and praising the Lord.

Responsive Psalm 72:1-2, 7-8, 10-11, 12-13 - "Lord, every nation on earth will adore you."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Ephesians 3:2-3, 5-6 - Paul declares that the mystery of God was made known to him as it was not made known in other generations. The Spirit has made the apostles and the prophets coheirs in the promise of Christ Jesus through the good news of faith.

Gospel of Matthew 2:1-12 - The full story of the Epiphany and the Magi arriving to find the newborn King of the Jews. See the front page of this bulletin and read the entire story on your own!

Sunday, January 14th (Second Sunday in Ordinary Time)

First Reading from the First Book of Samuel 3:3-10, 19 - The call of the Lord to Samuel the future prophet and Samuel's interaction with Eli, his mentor. Three times the Lord called to Samuel who did not recognize the call. Finally Samuel recognized the call with "Here I am, Lord. Speak, for your servant is listening"

Responsive Psalm 40:2, 4, 7-8, 8-9, 10 - "Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will."

Epistle Reading from the First Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians 6:13-15, 17-20 - Paul exhorts the people to avoid immorality. Your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit. Your body is a member of Christ. Glorify God with your body.

Gospel of John 1:35-42 - Two future disciples were with John when Jesus walked by. John told them to "Behold the Lamp of God," and the disciples followed Jesus to see where he was staying and what he was preaching. One of the two was Andrew, the brother of Simon, and he went to his brother and told him that they had found the Messiah. When Simon went to Jesus, He looked at him and said that from then on he would be called Peter, and Peter, along with Andrew, continued to follow Jesus.

Sunday, January 21st (Third Sunday in Ordinary Time)

First Reading from the Book of Jonah 3:1-5, 10 - Jonah is instructed by God to go to the city of Nineveh and warn the people that God will destroy the city if they do not change their ways. At Jonah's teaching, the people repented and God did not destroy Nineveh.

Responsive Psalm 25:4-5, 6-7, 8-9 - "Teach me your ways, O Lord."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians 7:29-31- Paul warns the people of Corinth that time is running out and if they do not repent, the world in its present form will pass away.

Gospel of Mark 1:14-20 - After John was arrested, Jesus continued His ministry in Galilee warning the people that the Kingdom of God is at hand and they should all repent and believe in the gospel. Mark tells the story of Jesus seeing fishermen at the Sea of Galilee and He welcomes them to follow Him. They all abandon their nets and their boats and began to follow Jesus. These were part of the twelve.

Sunday, January 28th (Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time)

First Reading from the Book of Deuteronomy 18:15-20 - Moses tells the people that God will raise up a prophet from among them whom they should listen to for God will put His words in the mouth of the prophet. Anyone who does not listen to God's words will have to answer to it. Anyone who speaks in the name of other gods will die.

Responsive Psalm 95:1-2, 6-7, 7-9 - "If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians 7:32-35 - Paul tells the people of Corinth that they should avoid all anxieties. Married or unmarried men and married or unmarried women all exhibit anxieties. Paul says that, for their own sakes, they all should be restrained and adhere to the Lord without distraction.

Gospel of Mark 1:21-28 - Jesus and his disciples went to Capernaum on the Sabbath and Jesus taught in the synagogue. The people were amazed that Jesus taught with authority, not as the Scribes taught. In the synagogue was a man possessed by an unclear spirit who rebuked Jesus for having come to destroy the people. The spirit within the man called out to Jesus in anger. Jesus told the spirit to come out of the man, which happened immediately. The people were amazed that Jesus commanded the unclean spirit who obeyed Him. nd Jesus' fame spread throughout the region of Galilee.




As we begin 2024, we have entered into **Cycle B** of the Lectionary cycle of the Liturgical year, which means that most of the Gospel stories in the coming months will be taken from the Gospel according to **Mark** (Matthew is used in Cycle A and Luke is used in Cycle C). Here are some highlights of Mark's Gospel in chronological order:

John the Baptist • Baptism of Jesus (no birth story in Mark) • temptation of Jesus in the desert • the first disciples called • cures (man possessed by the devil, leper, paralytic, withered hand, blind mute) • parables (sower, lamp, mustard seed) • calming the storm • feeding the 5000 • walking on water • Transfiguration • entering Jerusalem • incident with money changers in the Temple • Judas • Last Supper • denial by Peter • agony in the gar-den • arrest of Jesus • Pilate's court • carrying the cross • Simon of Cyrene • crucifixion • entombment • empty tomb • post-resurrection appearances • Ascension

Stay tuned to the Sunday Gospels for the rest of the year to hear the above stories (and others) proclaimed.

Who are the KCs?

Don't confuse KC with KFC! The Knights of Columbus (KCs) goes way back to 1882 when it was founded by Fr. Michael McGivney in

New Haven, CT, with a mission of charity to God's people. During WWI, the Knights of Columbus provided services under the motto "Everybody Welcome, Everything Free" - a philosophy upheld in today's charitable programs. The Great Depression led to a renewed sense of volunteer service - and Knights across the nation stepped up. In 1954, the words "under God" were added to the U.S. Pledge of Allegiance completing an effort the Knights had begun three years earlier. During John Paul II's pontificate, the Knights strengthened ties to the Church through increased support of the Vatican. This is but a miniature history of the KCs. Today, the Knights give our HF men a way to put their faith into action by supporting various ministries of the parish and responding to Fr. Fred's call when there is a need for hospitality or service to the people of the parish. The Parish Council KC # is 15750. HOLY FAMILY CATHOLIC CHURCH CHALLENGES FOR JANUARY

In the Book of Exodus [Chapter 25], God gave Moses instructions about building the **Ark of the Covenant** (representing the "Covenant" between God and His people) using wood and gilding the box with gold. It was to be adorned with two gold angels and be able to be carried by wooden poles through rings in the Ark. God commanded Moses to place in the Ark the stone tablets given



to him on Mount Sinai. The Ark was then carried by Moses' men on the years-long trek through the desert on the way to the Promised Land. Each night, the Ark would be placed under a tent to wait for the next day's journey. Along the way, the story of the manna in the

desert unfolded, in which God provided food for the hungry and disgruntled Israelites. From that point on, God also commanded that a gold jar containing fragments of the manna should be placed in the Ark, along with the staff of Aaron which had mystically budded, blossomed and produced almonds to show that Aaron should be the leader of the tribe of Levi, the priestly tribe [Numbers 17]. When the Israelites finally reached the Promised Land, they built a temple and placed the **Ark of the Covenant** - and its three contents - within the inner recesses of the temple, behind a veil [see Hebrews 9:2-5], to be prayed to by the high priest from the Tribe of Levi on the Day of

Atonement to explate the sins of the Hebrews. Such was the case with Zechariah, the father of John the Baptist which began this month's challenge story.

Above left is a bas-relief from the Cathédrale d'Auch in the Pyrenees of France which shows the Israelites carrying the Ark as they progressed from one camp site to the next during their long migration in the wilderness headed toward the Promised Land; and below is a mock rendition of the Ark as it would have been in the inner sanctum of the Temple.
