Sunday, June 30th (Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time)

A reading from the Book of Wisdom 1:13-15, 2:23-24 - God did not create death. God does not rejoice in the destruction of the living. God made humans in His own image. But by the envy and evil of the devil, death entered the world and they who follow the devil will experience that death.

Responsive Psalm 30:2, 4, 5-6, 11, 12, 13: "I will praise you, Lord, for you have rescued me."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Second Letter to the Corinthians 8:7, 9, 13-15 - Through the gracious acts of Jesus, you can excel in faith and knowledge and love. Because of equality, you will not be burdened while others have relief. Your abundance may hep supply their needs, and their abundance may supply your needs.

Gospel of Mark 5:21-43 - A number of cures and miracles are recorded. A synagogue official begged Jesus to go with him to cure his daughter who was at the point of death. Along the way, a woman who suffered from hemorrhages sought out Jesus and touched His robe and was immediately cured. Jesus told the woman that her faith in Him had saved her. Still on the way to the official's house, people caught up with them and told the official not to bother Jesus any further since the daughter had already died. Jesus continued to the house anyway and proclaimed that the daughter was not dead but was only sleeping. He was ridiculed, but Jesus entered the room where the child was, took her hand, and told her to stand up, which she did and was cured.

Sunday, July 7th (Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time)

A reading from the Prophet Ezekiel 2:2-5 - Ezekiel tells how he was spoken to by the Lord Himself and told to go to the Israelites who had abandoned God and tell them whether they resist or heed his words, that they should know that he, Ezekiel, is a prophet among them.

Responsive Psalm 123:1-4 - "Our eyes are fixed on the Lord, pleading for His mercy."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Corinthians 12:7-10 - Paul says that event with the revelations that have been given to him, he still must be aware of Satan who continues to challenge him - and challenge the people to whom Paul is preaching. For the sake of Christ, even when he deals with weakness, he is strong.

Gospel of Mark 6:1-6 - On the Sabbath, Jesus went to the synagogue with His disciples and preached to the people there. Jesus was concerned about the lack of faith the people showed to Him.

Sunday, July 14th (Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time)

A reading from the Book of Amos 7:12-15 - Amos tells how he was sent to the land of Judah to become a prophet even though he was only a shepherd in Bethel where he was prohibited from prophesying there.

Responsive Psalm 85: 9-14 - "Lord, let us see your kindness, and grant us your salvation."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Ephesians 1:3-14 - Paul praises God who has blessed us by sending Christ. We have been adopted by God, and we have been redeemed by the blood of Christ. Hear the Gospel of salvation and believe in Jesus who spoke the word of truth. Praise be the name of the Lord.

Gospel of Mark 6:7-13 - Jesus sent the twelve Apostles out two-by-two to preach and heal within the towns. They were to stay in homes along the way, drive out demons and anoint those who were sick and cure them.

Sunday, July 21st (Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time)

A reading from the Prophet Jeremiah 23:1-6 - Through Jeremiah, the Lord warned people that if they do not guide and embrace their flock, their evil deeds will be punished. Woe to shepherds who scatter their flock. The Lord will gather the remnants of the flock and bring them back to the meadow of Judah and they will be saved.

Responsive Psalm 23: 1-6 - "The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Ephesians 2:13-18 - Paul reminds the people that even if they were once far away, they have been brought near by the blood of Jesus and His Resurrection. Jesus has established a reign of peace, giving us access to one Spirit in the Father.

Gospel of Mark 6:30-34 - Jesus and His disciples needed some rest, so they went to a place by themselves. But the people saw them headed off in a boat and followed their trail, arriving even before the disciples did. When Jesus and the others arrived, He felt sorry for the people who seemed to be wondering, like sheep without a shepherd. So He began to teach them the Word of God.

Sunday, July 28th (Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time)

A reading from the Second Book of Kings 4:42-44 - Elisha was given twenty barley loaves and stalks of fresh grain. He told his servants to give the food to the people to eat for they were hungry. But the servants objected, saying that there was not enough food for the hundreds of people who were starving. Elisha told them to spread the food anyway because the Lord would provide and the people would eat and even have some leftovers.

Responsive Psalm 145:10-11, 15-18 - "The hand of the Lord feeds us; He answers all our needs."

Epistle Reading from St Paul's Letter to the Ephesians 4:1-6 - Paul tells the people to live lives filled with humility, gentleness and patience. They should bear with one another through love. There is one body, one Spirit, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, and one God who is over all and through all and in all.

Gospel of John 6:1-15 - This is the well-known story of the "multiplication of the loaves and fish," which is unique as it is the only miracle story of Jesus that appears in all four Gospels. In John's version, five loaves and two fish were miraculously shared with 5000+ people, and they believed that Jesus was the truly the Prophet.

Believe it or not [C], a verse from Leviticus 25:10, is actually forged right onto the bell: "Proclaim LIBERTY throughout all the land unto all the inhabitants thereof."



Although [A] long predates the bell (1215), no clauses from the Magna Carta appear on it.

WHO WAS ST. APOLLINARIS?

On July 20th, the Church celebrates the feast day of Saint Apollinaris. Does this name sound familiar? In our neighboring Napa, there are Catholic Churches named St. John the Baptist, St. Thomas Aquinas, and St. Apollinaris (familiarly called Saint A's!). And who was Apollinaris in Catholic tradition? The short answer is that he was a bishop and martyr of the Church.

Apollinaris was born in Antioch in what is now Turkey, and was converted to the Christian faith by St. Paul and St. Barnabas. He was encouraged to go to Rome, and there was ordained a bishop by St. Peter himself and sent to Ravenna to preach the Gospel of Jesus. His success there caused him to be exiled from Ravenna multiple times, but he always returned to continue preaching. After many beatings, Apollinaris was killed for his faith.

Here is a prayer that is recited on his feast day:

Saint Apollinaris, persecution, beatings, and exile did not deter you from fulfilling your mission of winning souls for the Kingdom of God. You were so relentless in your devotion to the Gospel that you never gave up, despite the many sufferings you endured. Please pray for me, that I will discover the same courage that you had and fulfill my mission with unwavering faith.
