Here's a Saint remembered this month on his Feast Day of November 4th: St. Charles Borromeo (1500s), Cardinal from Milan, who defended the Church world-wide against the Protestant Reformation and who set up the first series of Sunday School classes to educate the youth in Italy.



"I've stirred up their sense of moral responsibility. Now go out and hit 'em with some funny stuff on tithing and stewardship."

Sunday, November 3rd (Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time)

A reading from the Book of Deuteronomy 6:2-6 - Moses told the people to keep all the statutes and commandments of God. In that way, they can prosper more and be led to the Promised Land. They must love the Lord with all their heart, all their soul, and all their strength.

Responsive Psalm 18:2-4, 47, 51 - "I love you, Lord, my strength."

Epistle Reading from Hebrews 7:23-28 - The priests of the people could not remain in office due to all people being susceptible to death. Jesus, on the other hand, remains forever. His priesthood does not pass away. Jesus is able to save those who approach God through Him. His intercession lasts forever.

Gospel of Mark 12:28-34 - One of the Scribes wanted to challenge Jesus and asked Him which is the greatest of all the commandments. Jesus replied that the first is to love God with all you heart and soul and mind and strength. And the second is to love your neighbor as yourself. There are no commandments greater than these. Since the Scribe showed understanding with the response, Jesus said to him that he is not far from the kingdom of God. With that, the others were afraid to ask Him any more questions.

Sunday, November 10th (Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time)

A reading from the First Book of Kings 17:10-16 - The story of the Prophet Elijah entering a town and seeing a woman gathering sticks. Elijah asks her to retrieve a cup of water and a bit of bread for him. The woman tells him that she is poor and has nothing to eat and if she is able to cook some bread for herself and her son with the twigs she is collecting, they will eat iand die. Elijah predicts for her that her jar and jug would not run dry, and it came about that she had enough for her and her son to eat for a year, just as foretold by Elijah.

Responsive Psalm 146:7-10 - "Praise the Lord, my soul!"

Epistle Reading from the Letter to the Hebrews 9:24-28 - Christ appears in heaven before God on our behalf. The sacrifice of Himself has taken away sins. His second coming will bring salvation to those who await Him.

Gospel of Mark 12:38-44 - Jesus warned the crowds to be wary of the scribes who are hypocrites. Jesus watched the people putting their tithes into the temple treasury and when a poor woman put in two small coins, Jesus told the crowd that others contributed from their surplus wealth but she contributed all she had from her poverty.

Sunday, November 17th (Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time)

A reading from the Book of Daniel 12:1-3 - Daniel heard the Lord speaking to him about how the wise will rise in splendor and those who lead others to justice will be as numerous as the stars in heaven.

Responsive Psalm 16:5, 8-11 - "You are my inheritance, O Lord!"

Epistle Reading from the Letter to the Hebrews 10:11-14, 18 - While priests can offer many sacrifices for the forgiveness of sins, Jesus offered one sacrifice and because of it, those consecrated are made perfect forever.

Gospel of Mark 13:24-32 - At the end of time, the Son of Man will come in the clouds with great power and glory and will gather the elect from the ends of the earth. Jesus uses the parable of the fig tree to illustrate this: when the branches sprout leaves, the coming of summer is near. So too when signs come from the skies, be prepared for the earth to pass away, but His words will never pass away. When will that happen? No one knows except God

Here's a Saint remembered this month on his Feast Day of November 10th: St. Leo the Great (400s), who was the Pope who met with Attila the Hun and persuaded him not to invade Italy and later promulgated the definition of Christ being the union of two natures, divine and human, united in one person.

Sunday, November 24th (Feast of Christ the King)

A reading from Daniel 7:13-14 - A vision to Daniel showed Jesus coming from the clouds in glory and kingship.

Responsive Psalm 93:1-2, 5 - "The Lord is king; He is robed in majesty."

Epistle Reading from Revelation 1:5-8 - Jesus, the ruler of the earth, will come amid the clouds and be seen by all. He says, "I am the Alpha and the Omega, the one who is and who was and who is to come, the almighty."

Gospel of John 18:33-37 - When Pilate asks Jesus if He is the King of the Jews, Jesus skirts the answer, indicating that His kingdom does not belong to this world, that He came into the world to testify to the truth.

Sunday, December 1st (First Sunday in Advent)


A reading from Jeremiah 33:14-16 - The Lord says that the day of promise will come to Israel, that a descendant of David will appear to do what is right and just throughout the land.


Responsive Psalm 25:4-5, 8-10, 14 - " To you, O Lord, I lift my soul."

Epistle Reading from Pauls First Letter to the Thessalonians 3:12–4:2 - Paul prays that the people will increase and abound in love for one another. He prays the they will be blameless and holy before God. He exhorts the people to follow the instructions given them by the Lord Jesus.

Gospel of Luke 21:25-28, 34-36 - Jesus foretells about the end of times: there will be signs in the sun, moon, and stars. The people will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and glory. Stand erect and hold your head high; don't let your hearts become drowsy and don't let the word trap you into turning away from God. Be vigilant so you will have the strength to stand before God when the day comes.

Here's a Saint remembered this month on his Feast Day of November 11th: St. Martin of Tours (300s), heralded as the patron saint of the Third Republic of France and best known for the story of him cutting his own cloak in two, to give half to a beggar clad only in rags in the depth of winter.

HOLY FAMILY CATHOLIC CHURCH CHALLENGE FOR NOVEMBER

When the Catholic Church declares holy people to be Saints, we are assured they are in heaven and eager to intercede for us. The process to declare a person a Saint contains multiple steps and takes quite a while:

- 1. Recognition and devotion by groups of people who recognize the holy and exemplary life that was lived by the potential candidate.
- 2. A religious order or a bishop petitions the Vatican to begin considering the person for sainthood. If Rome gives the OK, a tribunal is formed to look into the candidate's life to determine a holy and virtuous life. The results are presented to the Congregation for the Causes of Saints in Rome.
- 3. This Congregation submits a report to the Pope to recommend proceeding or not based on all the data collected. The Pope then determines if the candidate is to be declared "Venerable," that is to continue along the process, or declared "Blessed" if the evidence shows they were martyred for the faith.
- 4. For those declared Venerable or Blessed, miracles attributed to their intercession are sought. Two miracles are required to be verified for the Venerable and one miracle verified for the Blessed.
- 5. Once the Church validates a miracle(or two) to be attributed to the person, canonization will follow. The pope will conclude the process by announcing the Blessed person is now part of the Canon of Saints. Whew quite a process!

Here's a Saint remembered this month on his Feast Day of November 30th: St. Andrew the Apostle (1st Century), was the brother of St. Peter and one of the first fishermen to be called by Jesus to follow Him.
