

Sunday, December 29th (Feast of the Holy Family)

A reading from Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14 - The people are admonished to take care of their fathers, for such kindness will not be forgotten. Children should revere their father and bring comfort to their mother.

Responsive Psalm 128:1-5 - "Blessed are those who fear the Lord and walk in his ways."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Colossians 3:12-21 - Paul admonishes the community at Colossus that they should show compassion, kindness and patience. They should forgive one another just as the Lord has forgiven them. If they have a grievance against another, they must forgive them and let peace control their hearts. For husbands, wives and children to live in harmony is pleasing to the Lord.

Gospel of Luke 2:41-52 - The familiar story of Mary, Joseph and Jesus (when he was twelve years old) going to Jerusalem for the feast of Passover. On the return, Mary assumed that Jesus was with his father and Joseph assumed he was with his mother or other relatives. In reality, Jesus remained behind in Jerusalem. When Mary and Joseph returned to find Him, they discovered Him in the temple sitting among the teachers, asking them questions and correcting their errors. His parents were anxiety-ridden but were astonished at His knowledge. When asked why He had not initially returned home with His parents, He told Mary and Joseph that He was in the temple because that is where He needed to do His father's business. He then returned with them to Nazareth.

Wednesday, January 1st (Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God)

A reading from Numbers 6:22-27: The Lord told Moses to bless the Israelites, invoking the Lord's name to give them blessings and shower them with the peace of God who gives them grace and love.

Responsive Psalm 67:2-3, 5, 6, 8: "May God bless us in his mercy."

Epistie Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Galatians 4:4-7: Paul tells the Galatians that they are children of God because God sent His Son, born of a woman, to ransom the people and God sent the Spirit to reside in their hearts. The people are not slaves any longer; they are heirs of the Kingdom of God.

Gospel of Luke 2:16-21: The continuation of the Nativity story where shepherds visited the Holy Family in Bethlehem. Mary heard the story of the shepherds told to them by the angel and she reflected on all that had happened. Eight days after the birth, Jesus was circumcised according to the Jewish custom.

Sunday, January 5th (Feast of the Epiphany)

A reading from Isaiah 60:1-6: The Lord shines over all His people and appears in His radiance. Look about and see the glory of the Lord. Your heart will overflow. Caravans of camels shall come from the East bearing gifts and proclaiming the praise of the Lord.

Responsive Psalm 72:1-2, 7-8, 10-11, 12-13: "Lord, every nation on earth will adore you."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Ephesians 3:2-3, 5-6: Paul tells the people that the mystery of God has been reveled to him through revelation. It was not revealed previously, but has been made known to the apostles and prophets by the Spirit. The Gentiles too are coheirs and members of the same body of Christ. All this has been promised by Christ through the teaching of the gospel.

Gospel of Matthew 2:1-12: The familiar story of the Magi from the East following the star and asking Herod where the newborn king could be found. When told they could find Him in Bethlehem, they proceeded on their trip to visit the Holy Family, offering the child their gifts, and returned directly to their home land.

Sunday, January 12th (Baptism of the Lord)

A reading from Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7: The Lord prefigures the coming of Christ, the Chosen one. He will establish justice on the earth and all will await His teaching. He will open the eyes of the blind and bring out those who live in darkness and make them a light for all nations.

Responsive Psalm 29:1-2, 3-4, 3, 9-10: "The Lord will bless His people with peace."

Epistle Reading from Acts of the Apostles 10:34-38" Peter spoke to those gathered and reminded them that they are all acceptable to God. He reminded the people that John preached and anointed Jesus with the Holy Spirit and with power, Jesus then went about doing good deeds and healing those possessed by the devil.

Gospel of Luke 3:15-16, 21-22: When the people asked John if he was the anticipated Christ, he said no, that one greater than he was coming who will baptize with the Holy Spirit and not just water, When Jesus was indeed baptized by John, the heavens opened and the Holy Spirit descended upon Jesus in the form of a dove and God spoke from heaven: "You are My beloved Son; with You I am well pleased."

Sunday, January 19th (The Second Sunday in Ordinary Time)

A reading from Isaiah 62:1-5: Isaiah assures Zion that it will no longer be forsaken or desolate. The Lord will call it espoused and a delight. The Lord will make the land His spouse and rejoice in it.

Responsive Psalm 96:1-2, 2-3, 7-8, 9-10: "Proclaim his marvelous deeds to all the nations."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians 12:4-11: A well known passage where Paul tells his followers in Corinth that each has a special grace or gift from the Spirit which differs from others' gifts. Some have the gift of prophesy or healing or speaking in tongues or interpretation of tongues or mighty deeds.

Gospel of John 2:1-11: The story of the wending feast at Cana attended by Jesus and Mary. When the wedding party ran out of wine, Mary told the Sewards to do what Jesus tells them to do. The stewards filled huge jars with water, and Jesus miraculously turned the water into choice wine for all to enjoy at the wedding reception.

Sunday, January 26th (The Third Sunday in Ordinary Time)

A reading from Nehemiah 8:2-6, 8-10: Ezra, the priest and prophet, read from the scroll of the law to all the people assembled from morning to night. When the people heard God's word proclaimed, they bowed down and accepted the word of God to be their strength.

Responsive Psalm 19:8, 9, 10, 15: "Your words, Lord, are Spirit and life."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians 12:12-30: A body has many parts but remains as one body. So too, Paul says, is Christ - there are many parts of His Kingdom but all remain one Kingdom. We are each separate, but we remain pat of the one body of Christ whether Jew or Greek, slave or free. All parts of the body should be treated with respect regardless of the gifts afforded to each body.

Gospel of Luke 1::1-4; 4:14-21: Luke tells the reason that he set out to write down the story of Jesus as he experienced it. Luke tells of Jesus going to the synagogue on the sabbath and reading from the scroll of the prophet Isaiah, and then interpreting the writings for all who were listening. The portion of Isaiah that He read included the need to bring glad tidings to the poor, liberty to the captives, sight to the bind and proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord. [see this month's challenge on the cover for a fulfillment of this proclamation!]

Lubiles Very 1000 was declared by Dana Lee VIII and prodeimed to be a year of requelening the faith

Jubilee Year 1900 was declared by Pope Leo XIII and proclaimed to be a year of reawakening the faith.



CONFIRMATION ANNOUNCEMENT



HOLY FAMILY CATHOLIC CHURCH CHALLENGE FOR JANUARY

The word "Jubilee" comes from the Hebrew yobel, which refers to the ram's horn used to announce a special event in the Old Testament. God told Moses that every fiftieth year should be set aside for seeking absent members of the tribes, restoring land to its owners, releasing of slaves and forgiveness of debts; and thus, the yobel was blown to announce this special event in the lives of the Hebrews.

This Jubilee was resurrected in the 1300s by Pope Boniface VIII who declared a Year of Jubilee, during which full remission of sins would be granted to those who confessed their sins and made a pilgrimage to St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. This jubilee was repeated every 100 years and then shortened to every 50 years and then shortened again to every 25 years as it is today. The last **Jubilee Year in 2000** was proclaimed by Pope John Paul II and had the theme of forgiveness of sins committed throughout history.

This coming Jubilee Year of 2025, proclaimed by Pope Francis, will be marked by the theme "Hope in God does not fade." We will concentrate during the year, according to Pope Francis, "on recovering the confident trust that we require, in the Church and in society, in our interpersonal relationships, in international relationships, and in our task of promoting the dignity of all persons and respect for God's gift of creation." [Spes Non Confundit 25]

During each Jubilee Year, a Holy Door on the right front side of St. Peter's Basilica is unsealed and the faithful are allowed to enter St. Peter's through this special ingress. Walking through this portal symbolizes a pilgrim's journey of conversion. The Holy Door is resealed at the end of this Jubilee Year and will remain closed until 2050!

Note that Fr. Fred's pilgrimage journey to Rome and Northern Italy in September will allow the travelers from Holy Family to pass through this special Jubilee Year door as the group enters St. Peter's.
