SUNDAY MASS READINGS FOR APRIL

Sunday, March 30th (Fourth Sunday of Lent)

A reading from the Book of Joshua 5:9-12: While the Israelites were in Jericho near the Promised Land, they ate the Passover meal as they had done each year prior. The next day, the manna did not appear but the Israelites were then able to eat from the yield of the land of Canaan and their ordeal was over.

Responsive Psalm 34: 2-7: "Taste and see the goodness of the Lord."

Epistle Reading from the Second Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians 5:17-21: Paul tells the people that the old things have passed away and that new things have appeared in the form of Christ who has become a new creation. He called on the people to be ambassadors for Christ and allow God to appeal to others through them. In that way, they will be reconciled to God through Christ.

Gospel of Luke 15:1-3, 11-32: This is the parable of the Prodigal Son, spoken by Jesus to the Pharisees and Scribes who were complaining that Jesus was sharing himself with sinners. This parable appears only in Luke's Gospel. Listen well to the Gospel reading (or read these verses on your own) and you will readily remember the story and its moral. When you do, ask yourself which character seems closest to your own method of dealing with others (the father or the wayward son or the angry other son). Sunday, March 2 (Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time)

Sunday, April 6th (Fifth Sunday of Lent)

A reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah 43:16-21: Beyond the story of the past where God led the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt, now God makes a new dwelling for them with beasts and rivers and water for His people to drink and for them to announce the praise of the Lord.

Responsive Psalm 126:1-6: "The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Philippians 3:8-14: Paul tells the people that in spite of things that have been lost, gaining faith in Christ makes all the difference. Believe in His Resurrection and believe in what lies ahead and not way lies behind.

Gospel of John 12:1-8: The story of the woman caught in adultery who was brought before Jesus. The Pharisees tested Jesus to see if he would condemn the woman to be stoned as was the Law of Moses. The well-remembered answer from Jesus was "Let the one among you who is without sin throw the first stone at her." With that the Pharisees all left and Jesus was along with the woman. He told her that He does not condemn her and that she should go on her way and not sin any more.

Sunday, April 13th (Palm Sunday)

Procession with Palms Luke 19:28-40: Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem with the people waiving palms.

A reading from Isiah 50:4-7: The Lord gave Isaiah the ability to speak to the people and encourage them. He was given the courage not to be disgraced by speaking up about the Lord.

Responsive Psalm 22:8-9, 17-20, 23-24: "My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?"

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Philippians 2:6-11: Jesus came to earth, humbly coming in human likeness. God exalted Him o that at the name of Jesus, every knee on earth will bend and every tongue will profess that Jesus Christ is Lord.

Gospel of Luke 22:14 – 23:56: Luke's long version of the Last Supper (with the institution of the Eucharist), followed by Jesus going to the Mount of Olives to pray; whereupon Judas brought the crowds to arrest Jesus. Jesus was taken to face the authorities, Peter denied Jesus, and Jesus was led to Pilate who ordered that Jesus should carry His cross to Calvary where He was crucified, died, and placed into the tomb.

Saturday, April 19th (Easter Vigil)

From among 7 possible readings and 7 accompanying Responsive Readings, 3 or 4 are typically chosen to be proclaimed at the Easter Vigil Mass. See pg. 5 for a list of these possible readings.

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Romans 6:3-11: We who have been baptized into the life of Jesus have been buried with him through baptism into death. We have died with Christ and will live with Him. Death no longer has power over us for we live for God in Christ Jesus.

Responsive Psalm 118:1-2, 16-17,22-23: "Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia."

Gospel of Luke 24:1-12: At daybreak on Sunday, three women (Mary Madeline, Joanna and Mary the mother of James) travelled to the tomb of Jesus to prepare the body. But they found the stone rolled away and found two angels who told them that Jesus has been raised from the dead. They remembered the prophecy of Jesus about his rising from the dead, and went to tell the apostles what they had seen and heard.

Sunday, April 20th (Easter Sunday)

A reading from Acts of the Apostles 10:34, 37-43: Peter preaches to the crowds reminding them of the life of Jesus they had witnessed, of His death, and of His resurrection. He told them that Jesus ate and drank with them after He rose, and that we all will received forgiveness of sins through His holy name.

Responsive Psalm 118:1-2, 16-17, 22-23: "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Colossians 3:1-4: Since we were raised with Christ, we should seek what is above but not what is here on earth. We too will appear with Him in all His glory.

Gospel of John 20:1-9: John's version of Mary Magdeline going to the tomb early on Sunday morning and finding the stone rolled away from the tomb. She rushed to Peter to tell him what she had found and Peter returned to the tomb with another disciple and then found the tomb empty and the burial cloths rolled up. And the two did not understand what it meant.

Sunday, April 27th (Sunday of Divine Mercy)

A reading from Acts of the Apostles 5:12-16: The disciples were well-received and esteemed by the people who were baptized in large numbers. They brought the sick and possessed to the disciples and they were cured.

Responsive Psalm 118:2-4, 13-15, 22-24: "Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, his love is everlasting."

Epistle Reading from the Book of Revelation 1:9-13, 17-19: The disciple John tells of his story of being on the island of Patmos and experiencing the vision of heaven, including a vision of the glorified Jesus garbed in royal splendor. John fell down at the sight, and the Lord touched him and told him not to be afraid. He told John that once He (Jesus) was dead, but is now alive forever. He said that He is the *Alpha* and the *Omega* - the beginning and the end.

Gospel of John 20:19-31: The story that includes the "Doubting Thomas:" The disciples were in a locked room for fear of the authorities. Jesus miraculously stood in their midst and proclaimed, "Peace be with you." Jesus gave them the authority and power to forgive the sins of others. Thomas was not with them on the occasion and when told about the appearance of Jesus, he was skeptical. He said he would never believe a risen Jesus until he could see Him and touch Him. A week later, when Thomas was with the others, Jesus appeared again and said to Thomas that he should touch the wounds in his hands and in his side. At that, Thomas believed and was ashamed of his disbelief. Jesus blesses those who may not see Him but still believe in His divinity.




RELIGIOUS EDUCATION CLASSES

HOLY FAMILY CATHOLIC CHURCH CHALLENGE FOR APRIL

[1] NO. It's actually the other way around! The date for Easter is set first each year based on the phases of the moon: Easter falls on the first Sunday following the first full moon, following the vernal equinox. This equinox takes place on the first day of spring (March 20th this year) when there is an equal amount of sunlight and dark hours at all latitudes on the earth. The first full moon after that date will be on April 13th and the next Sunday will be Easter (for this year, April 20th). Working backwards, Ash Wednesday is 40 weekdays plus the 6 Sundays of Lent before Easter, which this year was on March 5th.

[2] YES, there actually is an Easter Island, which

is a remote inhabited island 2000+ miles off the west coast of South America in the South Pacific Ocean. It received its name because the first European explorers to find the island arrived there on an Easter Sunday. It is a distant territory of



Chile, and is especially well known for its monolithic stone statues (above), carved by hand by native islanders between 1100 and 1700.

[3] NO, the colored "Easter Egg" tradition actually began with early Christians near the Holy Lands (Mesopotamia) and spread to Greece and Western Europe. And yes, the eggs were initially all dyed red to represent the blood of Christ with the egg itself representing "new life," as in Christ's new life in resurrecting from the tomb.

[4] YES. Tradition indicates that pretzels were created by European monks during the 7th Century as special treats for the children in church. The bakers rolled out strips of dough and then crossed them to resemble two arms in prayer. Over the centuries, pretzels have taken on a life during Easter (as well as in beer pubs!).

[5] NO and YES! The four Gospels differ in a few details. Matthew's post-Resurrection version has Mary Magdeline and another unnamed Mary being the first at the tomb. In Mark's version, Mary Magdeline, Salome and Mary, mother of James, were the first to enter the empty tomb. In Luke's version, Mary Magdeline, Joanna and Mary. the mother of James, were the first to enter the empty tomb. In John's version, Mary Madeline approached the tomb, but seeing the stone rolled away, in fear and trepidation, went and told Peter, and he was the first to enter the tomb.
