



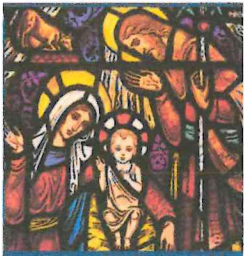

RIP POPE FRANCIS

Did you know that Pope Francis (born **Jorge Mario Bergoglio**; 17 December 1936 – 21 April 2025) had a number of "firsts" associated with his pontificate? He was the "first" pope to choose the papal name Francis (in honor of St. Francis of Assisi). He was the "first" pope ever chosen from below the equator (Argentina). He was the "first" pope to come from the Western Hemisphere (Buenos Aires). He was the "first" pope to come from the Jesuit Order. His reign of 12 years was



neither the shortest nor the longest, so no "first" here. He was the "first" pope in recent memory to stand firm on a conglomerate of issues such as environmental protection, world peace, protecting refugees, hearing the cry of the poor, social justice, human fraternity and solidarity, and lay leadership. Here is a prayer we can recite that was written by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops to pray for the late pope: ***Hear with favor our prayers, which we humbly offer, O Lord, for the salvation of the soul of Pope Francis, your servant and Priest, that he, who devoted a faithful ministry to your name, may rejoice in the perpetual company of your Saints. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.***


My Dear and Faithful Parishioners:

SUNDAY MASS READINGS FOR MAY

Sunday, April 27th (Sunday of Divine Mercy) See page 7

A reading from Acts of the Apostles 5:12-16: The disciples were well-received and esteemed by the people who were baptized in large numbers. They brought the sick and possessed to the disciples and they were cured.

Responsive Psalm 118:2-4, 13-15, 22-24: "Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, his love is everlasting."

Epistle Reading from the Book of Revelation 1:9-13, 17-19: The disciple John tells of his story of being on the island of Patmos and experiencing the vision of heaven, including a vision of the glorified Jesus garbed in royal splendor. John fell down at the sight, and the Lord touched him and told him not to be afraid. He told John that once He (Jesus) was dead, but is now alive forever. He said that He is the *Alpha* and the *Omega* - the beginning and the end.

Gospel of John 20:19-31: The story that includes the "Doubting Thomas." The disciples were in a locked room for fear of the authorities. Jesus miraculously stood in their midst and proclaimed, "Peace be with you." Jesus gave them the authority and power to forgive the sins of others. Thomas was not with them on the occasion and when told about the appearance of Jesus, he was skeptical. He said he would never believe a risen Jesus until he could see Him and touch Him. A week later, when Thomas was with the others, Jesus appeared again and said to Thomas that he should touch the wounds in his hands and in his side. At that, Thomas believed and was ashamed of his disbelief. Jesus blesses those who may not see Him but still believe in His divinity.

Sunday, May 4th (3rd Sunday of Easter)

A reading from Acts of the Apostles 5:27-32, 40-41 - The apostles had been warned not to teach in the name of Jesus, and yet they continued to do so and were brought to answer before the Sanhedrin. Peter told the court that they must obey God rather than obey mere mortals, The Sanhedrin ordered the apostles again to stop teaching in the name of Jesus and sent them away.

Responsive Psalm 30:2, 4-6, 11-13 - "I will praise you, Lord, for you have rescued me."

Epistle Reading from Revelation 5:11-14 - John tells of his dream of being surrounded by many angels and living creatures and elders. The angels cried out, "Worthy is the Lamb that was slain." The others around the throne of God also cried out to Honor the One who sits on the throne.

Gospel of John 21:1-19 - Following the Resurrection, Jesus appeared to the disciples at the Sea of Tiberius. After they had fished all night with no success, Jesus appeared on the shore and told them to cast their nets once again. The apostles caught so many fish that their boats were overflowing. Jesus then shared breakfast with them. Jesus asked Peter three times if he truly loved Him, and Peter said of course that he did.

Sunday, May 11th (4th Sunday of Easter)

A reading from Acts of the Apostles 13:14, 43-52 - Paul and Barnabas traveled to Antioch and called together a crowd to teach to the Gentiles assembled who believed in Jesus. The Jews, however, were angry that Paul and Barnabas would speak to non-Jews and they incited men of the city to persecute the two and drive them away.

Responsive Psalm 100:1-3, 5 - "We are his people, the sheep of his flock."

Epistle Reading from Revelation 7:9, 14-17 - John continues to recount his vision of heaven where a multitude from every nation and race were gathered around the throne before the Lamb. The Lamb at the center of the throne will shepherd the people and there will no longer be hunger or thirst, and no more tears will be shed.

Gospel of John 10:27-30 - Jesus told the people that they are His sheep and He hears their voices. He told the people to follow Him and they will gain eternal life and will never perish. The Father and Jesus are one, He says.

Sunday, May 18th (5th Sunday of Easter)

A reading from Acts of the Apostles 14:21-27 - Back in Antioch, Paul and Barnabas exhorted the disciples there to preserve in the faith. Even if they encounter many hardships, they will enter the Kingdom of God. The two disciples continued their teaching journey through the entire region of Asia Minor, preaching to the Gentiles.

Responsive Psalm 145:8-13 - "I will praise your name for ever, my king and my God."

Epistle Reading from Revelation 21:1-5 - John continues telling about his dream of seeing a new earth and a new heaven. He tells of a voice shouting that God's dwelling is with the human race and that they will be His people. The old order has passed away and God will wipe away every tear and there will be no more death or mourning.

Gospel of John 13:31-35 - When Judas left the Last Supper, Jesus told the rest that He would be with them only a short while longer. He gave them the Great Commandment to love one another as He had loved them.

Sunday, May 25th (6th Sunday of Easter)

A reading from Acts of the Apostles 15:1-2, 22-29 - When some were preaching that the Gentiles had to be circumcised in order to receive Christ, Paul, Barnabas, Judas and Silas were sent to Antioch to confront the situation of people speaking without authority. They told the people that it was the decision of the Holy Spirit that no burden such as circumcision should be placed on the people for them to be baptized and become believers.

Responsive Psalm 67:2-3, 5, 6, 8 - "O God, let all the nations praise you!"

Epistle Reading from Revelation 22:12-14, 16-17, 20 - John writes about the voice he heard telling him that Jesus is coming again, that He is the Alpha and the Omega, the first and the last. We will receive the gift of life-giving water when the Lord comes. And John says, "Yes, Lord, come."

Gospel of John 17:20-26 - Jesus prays to His Father, thanking Him for those He has been with on earth. He has given glory to them. They do not yet know the Father as Jesus does. The love of the Father will be in them also.

Sunday, June 1st (Celebration of the Ascension of the Lord)

A reading from Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11 - Luke introduces the Acts of the Apostles with summarizing what Jesus instructed them along the way both before and after the Resurrection, and telling them that they would soon be baptized with the Holy Spirit and that they should be His witnesses in Jerusalem. He gathered them together, and while they were looking, He was lifted up into the clouds.

Responsive Psalm 47:2-3, 6-9 - "God mounts his throne to shouts of joy: a blare of trumpets for the Lord."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Ephesians 1:17-23 - Paul prays that God will give the people a Spirit of wisdom and revelation, He reminds them that Jesus was raised from the dead and is seated at the right hand in the heavens,

Gospel of Luke 24:46-53 - Jesus reminded the disciples that He had told them that He would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day. Repentance for the forgiveness of sins should be preached in His name. Jesus promised that the Father would be with them when they returned to the city. Jesus blessed them and when He did so, He parted from them and was taken up to heaven. And they returned to Jerusalem with great joy.

† Knights of Columbus will host a prayer hour featuring the Sacred Heart of Jesus Icon. All parishioners are invited to attend this Hour of Prayer on FRIDAY MAY 2 at 7 PM at Holy Family Church. Through the Pilgrim Icon Program, we will have a prayer service featuring an icon depicting the most famous image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, painted in 1767 by Pompeo Batoni and now venerated in the Church of the Gesù in Rome. It is one of more than 300 icons traveling around the world, from council to council, for veneration and use in prayer services. Since the first traveling pilgrim icon of Our Lady of Guadalupe in 1979, more than 191,000 council and parish prayer services with some 23 million participants have been held.

Divine Mercy Sunday is celebrated each year on the Sunday after Easter. It is dedicated in memory of Sister Faustina Kowalska, a Polish nun, who reported visions and visitations from Jesus and conversations with Him. He asked her to paint the vision of his merciful divinity being poured from his Sacred Heart (as the holy card below shows) and specifically asked for a Feast of Divine Mercy to be established on the first Sunday after Easter Sunday, so that mankind would take refuge in Him and His outpouring of mercy and grace on those needing forgiveness of sins. A prayer we can all recite on that Sunday (or any Sunday) is: *Eternal Father, we offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Yours early beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ in atonement for our sins and for those of the whole world. Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world. Amen.*

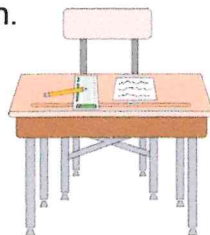

REMEMBER THE 14 STATIONS?

During Lent and on Good Friday, we walked the path of Jesus on the way to Calvary by praying the 14 Stations of the Cross. Terra cotta versions of the Stations are situated around the sanctuary of Holy Family beginning in the far left with Station 1 (Jesus is condemned to death), and then counterclockwise numerically around the sanctuary to Station 14 (Jesus is laid in the tomb).

Through the efforts of Deacon Mike and Father Fred, the 14 Stations of the Cross will be erected on 14 poles around our church property. The photo below shows the two attaching one of the Stations as a prototype of what each will look like. Check it out yourself outside of the church. We are almost ready to make the final order for all 14 Stations and get them erected outside. If any one of you is interested in donating the cost for one of the outdoor Stations, please see Fr. Fred for more info.



CHALLENGE FOR MAY

If you guessed that Pentecost was **40** days after Easter, you were close but not quite! Pentecost is actually **50** days after Easter, as we will see when June rolls around. So what is the significance of **40** during Eastertide? Jesus remained on the earth for **40** days following his Resurrection, appearing to the women, to the disciples, and other believers. On the **40th** day after the Resurrection, Jesus took some of His disciples up to a mountain top and rose up through the clouds into the heavens, leaving the disciples behind and bewildered. There are three scriptural references to the Resurrection:

† Mark 16:19-20
 † Luke 24:44-53
 † Acts 1:1-14.
