

[1] Including the Gospels and the Acts of the Apostles, how many of these books tell about the birth of Jesus? Only two: read Matthew 1:18 - 2:23 and Luke 1:26 - 56 and Luke 2:1 - 21.

[2] What was the name of the angel who visited Mary at the Enunciation? Gabriel was named in Luke 1:26.

[3] On her way to Bethlehem, does Mary ride on a donkey, a mule or a horse according to the Gospels? Luke's Gospel merely says that Joseph and Mary went from Nazareth to Bethlehem without mentioning any conveyance.

[4] How many Magi (Wise Men) visited the Christ child? Most people assume that there were three Magi or astrologers because they brought three gifts to the Christ child (gold, frankincense and myrrh) as in Matthew 2:11, but their number is not actually specified.

[5] What was the name of the angel who visited Joseph to warn him to flee with Mary and Jesus? Matthew 2:13 does not name the angel but simply refers to an angel of the Lord.

[6] Where did Joseph, Mary and Jesus end up when they fled from Nazareth? As written in Matthew 2:13-15, they went to hide in Egypt from Herod who wanted to kill Jesus.

Also, over forty boxes of

canned goods and boxed food items [right] have been collected during November. These will be delivered by the Kiwanis Club to the American Canyon Food Bank as our Thanksgiving offering for those in need in our community. We have truly lived up to Matthew 25 ("When I was hungry, you gave me to eat . . ."). Bless you all.



Our next parish-wide project will be our pre-Christmas collection drive to collect personal items and supplies for our less fortunate friends. We will partner with the NEWS Center of Napa to add items to their Hope Bags of emergency supplies for women. Another charity is called Expressions of Hope which is looking for packs filled with necessities for various ages of foster children. Finally, we will be putting together supplies in gallon-sized Blessing Bags for our unhoused community members. IMMACULATE CONCEPTION

The **Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception** celebrates the sinless lifespan and immaculate conception of the Virgin Mary, celebrated on December 8th each year, nine months before the Feast of the Nativity of Mary, celebrated on September 8th. Mass will be held at 9:30 am at Holy Family on Monday, December 8th to honor **Mary**.

HELLO ADVENT

The word **Advent** is taken from the Latin words *ad* and *venire* meaning "to come to," as in Jesus is coming to us shortly. A Latin derivative is *adventus*, used as a noun, it means "arrival." If you used to recite the Lord's Prayer in Latin, you would have included the phrase *ad veniat regnum tuum*, or "Thy kingdom come."

Advent is a Christian season of preparation and anticipation that begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas and ends on Christmas Eve. The First Sunday of Advent this year will be on November 30th. This also marks the first Sunday of the new liturgical year. The prior Sunday (the Feast of Christ the King) marked the end of the prior liturgical year. The season is a time for prayer, reflection, and acts of kindness, with a focus on hope and the coming of the King. It is often marked by traditions like an Advent wreath and candles. The candles often represent the themes of the season, with three purple candles representing hope, peace, and love. A fourth candle that is rose in color represents joy. A fifth white "Christ" candle may be lit at the end of Advent to represent Christ as the Light of the World.



To expand the significance of **Advent**, we recognize a twofold coming of Christ: firstly in the birth at Bethlehem, then in a perpetual coming to mankind in the Word and Sacraments, focusing on Jesus' presence in scripture and the Eucharist.

SUNDAY MASS READINGS FOR DECEMBER

Sunday, November 30th (First Sunday of Advent)

A reading from The Book of Isaiah 2:1-5 - This reading tells of a vision given to Isaiah about the mountain of the Lord's house. People climbed the mountain to the house of the God of Jacob so they could be instructed. When peace prevails, people will beat their swords into plowshares. They will all walk in the light of the Lord when no one trains for war.

Responsive Psalm 122:1-9 - "Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Romans 13:11-14 - Paul tells the people to awake from their slumber, to throw off darkness and put on light. They should put on the Lord Jesus Christ.

Gospel of Matthew 24:37-44 - Jesus reminded the people that before the flood in the days of Noah, the people disregarded the signs of the deluge to come. So too will be the coming of the Son of Man. No one knows when the day will come, so stay awake. It will be at an hour they will not expect, that the Son of Man will come.

Sunday, December 7th (Second Sunday of Advent)

A reading from the Book of Isaiah 11:1-10 - A prophesy that Jesus will come from the root of Jesse and that the spirit of the Lord will rest upon Him. He shall rule with justice; He shall strike the ruthless and slay the wicked. Those who are enemies shall band together, and their dwellings will be glorious.

Responsive Psalm 72:1-2, 7-8, 12-13, 17 - "Justice shall flourish in his time, and fullness of peace for ever."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Romans 15:4-9 - By the encouragement of the scriptures, you shall have hope. You will think in harmony with all others. Welcome all others as Christ welcomed you. With one voice, glorify God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Gospel of Matthew 3:1-12 - The story of John the Baptist preaching in the wilderness, and baptizing those who acknowledged their sins. He warns the Pharisees and Sadducees that every tree that does not bear good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire. John said that he baptized with water, but one coming after him will baptize with the Holy Spirit and fire.

Sunday, December 14th (Third Sunday of Advent)

A reading from the Book of Isaiah 35:1-6, 10 - The land will bloom with abundant flowers. Feeble hands and weak knees will be made firm. God comes to save you. The blind shall see; the deaf hear; the lame shall walk. Those who have been exiled will return to Zion rejoicing and singing with joy.

Responsive Psalm 146:6-7, 8-9, 9-10 - "Lord, come and save us."

Epistle Reading from the Book of James 5:7-10 - Those who are patient will see the coming of the Lord. Take an example from the prophets of old who were patient and spoke in the name of the Lord. The coming of the Lord is at hand.

Gospel of Matthew 11:2-11 - John the Baptist was in prison and sent his followers to confront Jesus and ask Him if He was the one to come after John, whom he had foretold. Jesus told them to tell John what they had seen and heard, with Jesus healing those who were inflicted. Jesus told them that they should help and support John since he was the messenger sent before Jesus to prepare the way.

Sunday, December 21st (Fourth Sunday in Advent)

A reading from the Book of Isaiah 7:10-14 - Isaiah said to Ahaz that the Lord will give him this sign: the virgin will conceive and bear a Son, who shall be named Emmanuel.

Responsive Psalm 24:1-6 - "Let the Lord enter; He is king of glory."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Romans 1:1-7 - Paul tells that he was called to be an apostle and that he preached the word that Jesus, the Lord, who was descended from David, resurrected from the dead will give each of us the grace of apostleship to be called holy.

Gospel of Mathew 1:18-24 - Matthew's version of the pre-birth of Jesus including the Annunciation, the angel appearing to Joseph to tell him to take Mary as his wife, and that when she bore a son He should be named Emmanuel, which means "God is with us."

Thursday, December 25th (Feast of the Nativity)

A reading from the Book of Isaiah 52:7-10 - Break out in song for the Lord comforts His people. Shout for joy for the Lord redeems Jerusalem. All the ends off the earth hear the news: Your God is King.

Responsive Psalm 98:1-6 - "All the ends of the earth have seen the saving power of God."

Epistle Reading from the Letter to the Hebrews 1:1-6 - In former days, God spoke through the prophets; in current day, God has spoken through the Son. When Jesus accomplished purification of sin, He took His seat at the right hand of the Majesty, far above the angels who worship Him.

Gospel of John 1:1-18 - The beginning of the Gospel of John, telling how the Father and Son were together from before the beginning of the world. It tells about the arrival of John the Baptist and that all who accepted his word became children of God; that is, the Word was made flesh and dwelt among us in the person of Jesus.

Sunday, December 28th (Feast of the Holy Family)


A reading from the Book of Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14 - Fathers and mothers, honor your children. Children give honor and pray for your fathers and mothers; your prayers are heard and bring comfort to your parents. Children, be considerate and kind to your parents; in that way, you will never be forgotten.

Responsive Psalm 128:1-2, 3, 4-5 - "Blessed are those who fear the Lord and walk in his ways."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Colossians 3:12-21 - All of God's children should put on compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience. As God forgives you, so you should forgive others. Let the peace, word, and wisdom of Christ dwell in you. Love and obey one another.

Gospel of Matthew 2:13-15, 19-23 - The story of Joseph being told in a dream that he should take Mary and the child Jesus and flee to Egypt as Herod was searching for the child to kill Him. After Herod's death, an angel told Joseph to return to Israel, to Galilee to the town of Nazareth.

Holy Family Parish continues to offer Communion for the sick and homebound. If you are interested (for yourself or others) contact the parish office.
