




PASTOR'S CORNER

SUNDAY MASS READINGS FOR JANUARY

Sunday, December 28th (Feast of the Holy Family)

A reading from the Book of Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14 - Fathers and mothers, honor your children. Children give honor and pray for your fathers and mothers; your prayers are heard and bring comfort to your parents. Children, be considerate and kind to your parents; in that way, you will never be forgotten.

Responsive Psalm 128:1-2, 3, 4-5 - "Blessed are those who fear the Lord and walk in his ways."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Colossians 3:12-21 - All of God's children should put on compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience. As God forgives you, so you should forgive others. Let the peace, word, and wisdom of Christ dwell in you. Love and obey one another.

Gospel of Matthew 2:13-15, 19-23 - The story of Joseph being told in a dream that he should take Mary and the child Jesus and flee to Egypt as Herod was searching for the child to kill Him. After Herod's death, an angel told Joseph to return to Israel, to Galilee to the town of Nazareth.

Sunday, January 4th (Feast of Epiphany)

A reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah 60:1-6 - Darkness covers the earth but the Lord shines over the world and His glory appears for all people. Camels will come from the East, bearing gold and frankincense and proclaiming the praises of the Lord.

Responsive Psalm 2:1-2, 7-8, 10-13 - "Lord, every nation on earth will adore you."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Ephesians 3:2-3, 5-6 - Paul tells the people that he received the grace of God and has understood the mystery of God through revelation. The Spirit has revealed these mysteries to the apostles and the prophets, and now is revealing them to the Gentiles.

Gospel of Matthew 2:1-12 - The story of the Magi arriving in Jerusalem from the East following a star, and asking King Herod where they might find the child. Herod questions his chief priests about such a child and he is told that the prophets tell of a ruler being born in Bethlehem. Herod sent the Magi to Bethlehem to search and told them to give him a report of what they might find. The Magi found the child with His mother Mary and offered gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. But they had been warned in a dream not to return to Herod so they went back to their own country by a different route.

Sunday, January 11th (The Baptism of the Lord)

A reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7 - The Lord tells of sending a servant to the people to bring about justice for all nations. The Lord formed the people and made a convenient with them so that the blind would see and those who live in darkness will see the light.

Responsive Psalm 29:1-2, 3-4, 3, 9-10 - "The Lord will bless his people with peace."

Epistle Reading from Acts of the Apostles 10:34-38 - Peter spoke to the people telling them that every nation who fears God and acts rightly will be acceptable to God. Peter instructed the people about the baptism that John preached and the anointing of Jesus with the power of the Spirit, and how He went about the countryside doing good works and healing those oppressed by the devil.

Gospel of Matthew 3:13-17 - The story of the baptism of Jesus by John in the Jordan River. When Jesus came up out of the water, the Spirit of God descended on Jesus in the form of a dove and a voice came from heaven proclaiming that Jesus is the Son with whom God is pleased.

Sunday, January 18th (Second Sunday in Ordinary Time)

A reading from the Book Isaiah 49:3, 5-6 - The Lord, who formed me from the womb as His servant, has spoken. I am made glorious in the sight of the Lord and God is now my strength, says Isaiah.

Responsive Psalm 40:2, 4, 7-8, 8-9, 10 - "Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will."

Epistle Reading from the First Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians 1:1-3 - Paul greets the Church in Corinth. They have been sanctified and made holy in Christ. He says to them: call upon the name of Jesus Christ and grace will be given to you and peace will follow you from God the Father.

Gospel of John 1:29-34 - Another encounter between Jesus and John the Baptist when John acknowledges that Jesus is the Lamb of God and will be made known to all of Israel. John recounts that after his baptism of Jesus, the Spirit descended like a dove and remained upon Him. While John baptized with water, Jesus will baptize with the Holy Spirit. He truly is the Son of God, says John.

Sunday, January 25th (Third Sunday in Ordinary Time)

A reading from the Book of Isaiah 8:23—9:3 - The anguish of the people has been conquered. The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light. Those who dwelt in gloom, a light has shone.

Responsive Psalm 27:1, 4, 13-14 - "The Lord is my light and my salvation."

Epistle Reading from the First Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians 1:10-13, 17 - Paul tells the Church in Corinth that there should be no divisions among themselves. He chastises them about the rivalries that have arisen between factions of the Church. He reminded them that it is not himself, Paul, who was crucified and rose, but that it was Christ who shares the wisdom of the ages.

Gospel of Matthew 4:12-23 - Jesus becomes disturbed when He hears that John had been arrested. Jesus left Nazareth and began teaching and preaching in Galilee, beyond the Jordan River. He told the people that they should repent for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand. At the Sea of Galilee, Jesus called to two fishermen, Peter and his brother Andrew, and told them to follow Him, which they did. He also called James and his brother John, and they too followed Him, teaching and proclaiming the Good News and curing diseases and illnesses among the people.
