
CHALLENGE FOR MARCH

We will celebrate Palm Sunday on the last weekend of this month. This month's challenge questions all have to do with Jesus' entry into Jerusalem: [1] This triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem (on what we now call Palm Sunday) is recorded in all 4 Gospels. True or False? [2] Palm Sunday always occurs on the Sixth Sunday of Lent. True or False? [3] Palm Sunday always begins Holy Week. True or False? [4] What animal does Jesus ride on as He enters Jerusalem? (a) donkey; (b) colt; (c) ass; (d) horse; (e) trick question - Jesus walked and didn't ride into Jerusalem. [5] What did the disciples do with their cloaks during Jesus' entry into Jerusalem? (a) spread them on the road; (b) waive them the air; (c) spread them on the animal's back. [6] What is the meaning of the exclamation "Hosanna" that the disciples shout along the way? [See the answers on page 5.](#)

LENTEN ABSTINENCE

According to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, everyone 14 years of age or older is bound to **abstain** from any meat which comes from birds or mammals on the Fridays of Lent. You may eat seafood such as fish or shrimp. You may eat eggs and dairy products. You may consume broth made from animal products. Exceptions exist for health or dietary reasons.



MARCH CHALLENGES

[1] Is correct: the story is found in Matthew 21:1-11; Mark 11:1-11; Luke 19:29-44; and John 12:12-19. [2] and [3] are both also true.

[4] Has multiple answers: Matthew refers to the animal as an ass along with her colt; Mark refers just to a colt; Luke refers just to an ass; and John refers to a donkey. So (a), (b) or (c) can be correct.



[5] Here again, the answer varies slightly from Gospel to Gospel: Matthew, Mark and Luke have the disciples first spreading their cloaks on the animal and then also on the road; while John does not mention the cloaks at all. In addition to (a) and (c) being correct, option (b) does not show up as the cloaks are not waved in the air. In addition, Matthew tells of the crowd laying tree branches on the ground, Mark says the people laid reeds on the ground, and John says the people greeted Jesus by waiving palm branches - as we do on Palm Sunday.



[6] All four Gospels tell of the crowd shouting "Hosanna" as Jesus passes by on his triumphal journey into Jerusalem. That is the same exclamation that we proclaim as part of the "Holy, Holy, Holy" during the Mass ("Hosanna in the highest"). This Hebrew word expresses adoration, praise and joy; more specifically, it translates from the Hebrew *hōšā'nā* into "save, we pray," as exemplified in Psalm 118:25 - "O Lord, grant salvation," and Matthew 21:9 where the expression "God save" or "Do save" refers to Jesus as the promised Savior.

THIRD WEEK IN LENT

Read John 4:5-42 (The Samaritan woman at the well). Our practice this week is to share our faith through conversations with our neighbors, through social media or through letter writing to our elected leaders.

FOURTH WEEK IN LENT

Read Ephesians 5:8-14 (Our righteous living brings light to the world and bears good fruit). Our practice this week is to collect fruit and other food staples to donate to our local food programs for the needy.

FIFTH WEEK IN LENT

Read John 11:1-45 (Raising of Lazarus from the dead). Our practice this week is to join together with others in prayer when our hearts are broken by injustice, violence and death - locally, nationally and worldwide.

SIXTH WEEK IN LENT

Read Matthew 26:14-27:66 (The Last Supper narrative). Our practice this week is to share Holy Week opportunities with our faith community as we commemorate Jesus' journey to His Resurrection.

SUNDAY MASS READINGS FOR MARCH

Sunday, March 1st (Second Sunday of Lent)

A reading from Genesis 12:14 - The Lord tells Abraham that he should go into the Promised Land and a great nation will come forth from his descendants who will be blessed. Abraham trusted in the Lord and did as he was directed.

Responsive Psalm 33:4-5, 18-22 - "Lord, let your mercy be on us, as we place our trust in you."

Epistle Reading from the Second Letter of Timothy 1:8-10 - Timothy tells the people they will be able to bear all hardships with the strength that comes from God. God calls us to a holy life and Christ bestows grace on all. He destroyed death and brought immortality through the Word of the Gospel.

Gospel of Matthew 17:1-9 - The account of the Transfiguration of Jesus on the mountain top appears in all four Gospels. This is Matthew's version that includes Peter, James and John experiencing Jesus becoming shining with His clothes becoming dazzling white. They experience the presence of Moses and Elijah and hear the voice of God speaking from a cloud. The disciples were fearful, but Jesus assured them that they should not be afraid but that they should reserve what they saw and heard in their hearts.

Sunday, March 8th (Third Sunday of Lent)

A reading from Exodus 17:3-7: The Israelites grumbled against Moses for leading them across the desert without sufficient water. Moses prayed to the Lord who told Moses to go to a particular location and strike a rock there with his staff. Immediately, water flowed out of the rock for the people to drink.

Responsive Psalm 95:1-2, 6-7, 8-9 - "If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Romans 5:1-2, 5-8: The love of God has been poured out to us by the Spirit through Our Lord Jesus Christ. God proved His love for us sinners when Jesus died for us and was risen.

Gospel of John 4:5-42: The familiar story of Christ encountering the Samaritan woman at Jacob's well. The woman was amazed that Jesus would even talk to her as a foreigner, but Jesus asked her for some water to drink. Jesus knew the woman's past so she declared Him a prophet. She told the townsfolk about Him and they came out to see the possible Messiah and to be baptized by Him.

Sunday, March 15th (Fourth Sunday of Lent)

A reading from 1 Samuel 16:1, 6-7, 10-13: The Lord sent Samuel to Bethlehem to anoint one of Jesse's sons as King. Samuel passed over the first seven sons but chose the youngest, David the Shepherd, and anointed him King in front of his brothers, and the Spirit of the Lord fell upon him.

Responsive Psalm 23: 1-6 - "The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want."

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Ephesians 5:8-14: Paul tells the people of Ephesus that they were once in darkness, but that they now possess the Light of Christ given to them by Jesus.

Gospel of John 9:1-41: Jesus encounters a man blind since birth. His disciples ask Him if this man is cursed with blindness because he sinned or because his parents sinned. Jesus rebukes them and said that no sin is involved and that He, Jesus, could do the work of God and heal the man. Jesus covered the man's eyes with mud and told him to wash it off in a pool - and immediately the man was cured.

Sunday, March 22nd (Fifth Sunday of Lent)

A reading from Ezekiel 37:12-14: A prophesy that the Messiah will open the people's graves and they shall rise from them into a heavenly kingdom. The Lord has promised to put the Spirit into the people.

Responsive Psalm 130:1-8: "With the Lord there is mercy and fullness of redemption.

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Romans 8:8-11: Do not be part of the flesh - be part of the Spirit. The Spirit of Christ dwells within them, the same Spirit that raised Jesus from the dead.

Gospel of John 11:1-45: The well-know story of the raising of Lazarus from the dead, foretelling Jesus' own raising from the dead. Jesus tells Lazarus' sisters Mary and Martha that Lazarus will rise, and they say they know he will on the Judgment Day. But Jesus says no, he will be raised through the power of the Lord now. When Jesus called Lazarus out of the tomb, the people witnessing this believed in Jesus.

Sunday, March 29th (Palm Sunday) - See the questions on the cover of the bulletin!

At the Procession with Palms - Matthew 21:1-11: Matthew's version of the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem on what we now refer to as Palm Sunday.

A reading from Isaiah 50:4-7: The Lord gave Isaiah the ability to speak to those in need who were weary and who needed to be uplifted in the word of the Lord.

Responsive Psalm 22:8-9, 17-20, 23-24: "My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?"

Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Philippians 2:6-11: Jesus took the form of a human and humbled Himself, becoming obedient, even to the point of death. God exalted Him and bestowed on Him the name of Jesus. At hearing that name, every knee should bend on earth and under the earth and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord.

Gospel of Matthew 26:14—27:66: Following the triumphal entry into Jerusalem at the beginning of the week, the Apostle Judas became jealous and told the high priests that he would be willing to help them arrest Jesus. At this time, people were flocking into Jerusalem to celebrate the yearly remembrance of the Passover. Jesus instructs His disciples to go and prepare the Seder (the Passover meal) in the upper room. This Gospel story continues with our well-known Last Supper story of Jesus predicting His arrest, using the elements of the Seder meal (unleavened bread and wine) to consecrate them into the Real Presence of His own body and blood. The group then go out to the Mount of Olives where Jesus predicts that Peter will deny Him and then on to the Garden of Gethsemane where Jesus prays and is accosted by the high priests when Judas betrays Him. This continues with Jesus being taken to the Sanhedrin where He is questioned and charged with blasphemy. Peter denies Jesus; Judas kills himself; Jesus is taken to Pilate; Barabbas is released rather than Jesus; Pilate wipes his hands of the matter; Jesus is taken to the Praetorium, stripped, given a crown of thorns and mocked; and led away to be crucified. The meeting with Simon of Cyrene to help carry the cross; the good and the bad thief crucified with Him; from noon to three o'clock; Jesus then cries out with a loud voice and gives up His spirit and dies. The women present go to Joseph of Arimathea who had a new grave nearby and they wrap Jesus in clean linen and place His body into the tomb. The authorities are afraid that the body will be stolen so they place a rock across the opening and place guards at the tomb for security.
