As you probably suspected, this month's challenge centers on Easter, which is the first Sunday of the month:

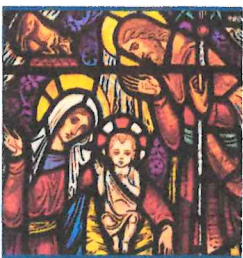
1. According to Scripture, who arrived first on Easter Sunday at Jesus' grave?

### LENTEN ABSTINENCE

According to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, everyone 14 years of age or older is bound to **abstain** from any meat which comes from birds or mammals on the Fridays of Lent. You may eat seafood such as fish or shrimp. You may eat eggs and dairy products. You may consume broth made from animal products. Exceptions exist for health or dietary reasons. PLUS, on Friday, April 3rd (Good Friday), we are challenged to **fast** that day. This applies to those 18-59 (again with exceptions for health or dietary reasons) and calls us to eat only one full meal and two smaller meals that, combined, do not equal a full meal.

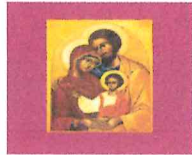

# HOLY WEEK

As we get ready for Holy Week, here are some thoughts and readings to help prepare you:

**Holy Thursday** - This day commemorates the occasion when Jesus gathered His Apostles to celebrate the Jewish festival of Passover by sharing the Seder meal with them. This commemorated the night that Moses told the Israelites to roast the sacrificial lamb and serve the unleavened bread, because the next day they would be passing over the restraints of the Pharaoh to begin their journey toward the Promised Land. At this particular Seder meal, Jesus instituted the Eucharist by changing the unleavened bread into his body and consecrating the cup of wine into his blood. Read more about this event in Matthew 26:17- 29; Mark 14:12-25; Luke 22:7-20; and 1 Corinthians 11:23-26. At the end of the supper, and after predicting Peter's denial of Christ and Judas' betrayal of Him, Jesus and the disciples went to the Garden of Gethsemane on the Mount of Olives to pray and wait for the inevitable.

And the inevitable was that at the prodding of Judas, Jesus was arrested by the crowd, the Apostles then scattered, and Jesus was taken to the high priest and the Sanhedrin for questioning. Read Matthew 26:57-69; Luke 22: 63-71; and John 18:19-24.

**Good Friday** - The next morning, Jesus was taken to Pilate, where he was again questioned and condemned to physical punishment and death on the cross. Read Matthew 27:27-32; Luke 23:125; and John 18:28-19:16

Following His beating and crowing with thorns, Jesus was led along the Way of the Cross (as we remember during our Stations of the Cross), was crucified and three hours later, died and was buried in the tomb. Read Matthew 27: 35-61; Mark 15:21-47; Luke 23:26-53; and John 19:16-42.

## SUNDAY MASS READINGS FOR APRIL

### Sunday, March 29th (Palm Sunday) -

**At the Procession with Palms - Matthew 21:1-11:** Matthew's version of the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem on what we now refer to as Palm Sunday.

**A reading from Isaiah 50:4-7:** The Lord gave Isaiah the ability to speak to those in need who were weary and who needed to be uplifted in the word of the Lord.

**Responsive Psalm 22:8-9, 17-20, 23-24:** "My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?"

**Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Philippians 2:6-11:** Jesus took the form of a human and humbled Himself, becoming obedient, even to the point of death. God exalted Him and bestowed on Him the name of Jesus. At hearing that name, every knee should bend on earth and under the earth and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord.

**Gospel of Matthew 26:14—27:66:** The long Passion Gospel of the stories of Holy Thursday and Good Friday including the arrest of Jesus, His movement toward the Cross, His death and burial.

### Sunday, April 5th (Easter Sunday)

**A reading from Acts of the Apostles 10:34, 37-43:** A sermon delivered by Peter telling about the wonders and marvels of Jesus - what He preached and how He healed; and how he commissioned the disciples to continue preaching to the people and how sins are forgiven through His name.

**Responsive Psalm 118:1-2, 16-17, 22-23:** "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad.

**Epistle Reading from Sr. Paul's Letter to the Colossians 3:1-4:** Think about what is above, not just what is here on earth. When Christ appears from above, you will appear with Him in His glory.

**Gospel of John 20:1-9:** When Mary Magdalene saw the stone removed, she ran to Peter worrying that they took the Lord's body out of the tomb. The two, plus another disciple, saw the burial clothes in the tomb, but they did not yet understand that Jesus had to rise from the dead.

### Sunday, April 12th (Divine Mercy Sunday)

**A reading from Acts of the Apostles 2:42-47:** The Apostles devoted themselves to teaching and breaking bread with the people. All worked together for the betterment of each other and ate their meals together, praising God and sharing with people. They added to their number with those saved.

**Responsive Psalm 118:2-4, 13-15, 22-24:** "Give thanks to the Lord for He is good, His love is everlasting."

**Epistle Reading from the First Letter of St. Peter 1:3-9:** Peter reminded the people that God gave His Son through His mercy and that they have a living hope through the Resurrection of Jesus. Even if they have not seen Jesus, they should love Him to gain the salvation of their souls.

**Gospel of John 20:19-31:** Jesus appears to the disciples and offers them peace. He institutes the sacrament of Reconciliation so the Apostles may forgive the sins of others. Thomas was not with the others to see Jesus, and was doubtful. Hence the story of the "Doubting Thomas," which we all know.

Sunday, April 19th (Third Sunday of Easter)

**A reading from the Acts of the Apostles 2:14, 22-33:** This is the first sermon that Peter preached after experiencing the resurrected Jesus. He has the fortitude to tell the people about the crucified and risen Jesus and proclaim that Jesus is now exalted at the right hand of God.

**Responsive Psalm 16:1-2, 5, 7-8, 9-10, 11:** "Lord, you will show us the path of life."

**Epistle Reading from First Letter of St. Peter 1:17-21:** Peter exhorts the people to conduct themselves with reverence. Their ancestors handed down the faith not as something perishable but with the blood of Jesus, who is the spotless lamb, raised from the dead and given eternal glory.

**Gospel of Luke 24:13-35:** The well-known story of two disciples on their way from Jerusalem to Emmaus who encounter the risen Jesus, without knowing who He was. They told this supposed stranger about the events back in Jerusalem, about Jesus being handed over for crucifixion but rising from the dead. Only when the three had a meal together and the third one broke bread and shared the cup, did they realize that they were in the presence of the risen Jesus Himself. The two went back to Jerusalem, found the eleven, and recounted their encounter with Jesus along the road.

Sunday, April 26th (Fourth Sunday of Easter)

**A reading from Acts of the Apostles 2:14, 36-41:** Another sermon from Peter delivered to the people assembled, where he told them to all to be baptized and repent from their sins in the name of Jesus Christ. About 3000 people were baptized that very day and added to the roll of those saved.

**Responsive Psalm 23:1-6:** "The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want."

**Epistle Reading from the First Letter of St. Peter 2:20-25:** You may suffer for doing what is right and just, but that is a grace from God. Just as Christ suffered, they may also suffer following in the footsteps of Jesus, who bore their sins upon the cross. If you have gone astray, return to the shepherd who is Jesus.

**Gospel of John 10:1-10:** Jesus reminds the people that He is the Good Shepherd and that He allows the people to enter into heaven like a shepherd allows the sheep to enter through the gates of the field. The shepherd calls the sheep by name and protects them from all evil. So too with Jesus.

## WHAT'S WITH THE ACTS OF THE APOSTLES?

We normally expect the first reading at each Sunday's Mass to be taken from the Old Testament (Hebrew scripture) such as from the Pentateuch (first five books of the Bible) or from one of the prophets (Isaiah or Jeremiah) or from one of the Wisdom books (Proverbs or Wisdom). But have you noticed that since Easter, all of the first readings in the lectionary have been taken from the Acts of the Apostles? This is intentional in order to shift the emphasis from the history of the Good News beginning with the Old Testament and matching it with readings in the New Testament - and switching the readings from the death and resurrection of Jesus to developing the new, young Church being formed by the Apostles following the Ascension of Jesus, all as recorded in the Acts of the Apostles. Acts is considered a continuation of the Gospel of Luke telling the story of the fledging new Church (at the time referred to as "The Way"). Enjoy this change from the normal lectionary readings which will resume after the Ascension and after Pentecost (which are both also recorded in Acts).

Monday, March 30th

Isaiah 42:1-7

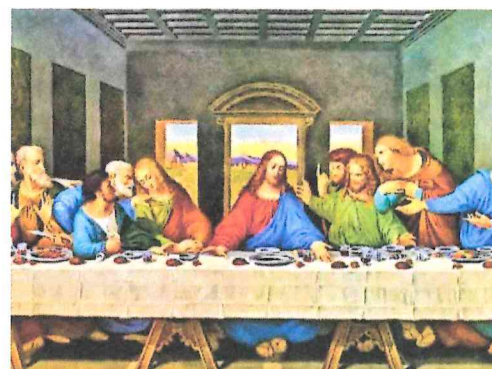
