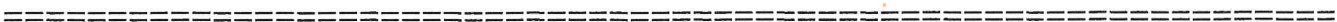

## MAY CHALLENGES

1. The Pentecost event does not appear in any of the Gospels! It is recorded only in Acts of the Apostles 2:1-41.
2. The events took place in Jerusalem where the Apostles retreated to after the Ascension of Jesus for fear of reprisal from the religious leaders.
3. Pentecost occurred 10 days after the Ascension, which itself was 40 days after the Resurrection of Jesus (see the next answer).
4. The word "Pentecost" comes from the Latin word *Pentecoste* and from the Greek *Pentekoste*, which both mean "fiftieth (day)." Pentecost was actually an established feast in the Hebrew religious tradition, signifying 50 days after Passover, which is what the Apostles were gathered to celebrate when the descent of the Holy Spirit occurred. In the Christian tradition, Pentecost occurs 50 days after the Resurrection.
5. The Acts of the Apostles tells that the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles and appeared as tongues of fire - as below - which parted and came to rest on each of them (Acts 2:3).



6. Since the Apostles were emboldened by the presence of the Holy Spirit, they felt the power to preach to the people about the risen Christ and what they must do to be saved. There were Jews in Jerusalem from all over the known world at the time to celebrate *Pentecoste* (see #4 above) who spoke multiple languages other than Aramaic (the local language). Amazingly, each foreigner heard the Apostles preach in their own language. This is referred to as "speaking in tongues," or "glossolalia," speaking in a language not previously known to the speaker. The listeners were amazingly able to understand the Apostles speaking in each of their own native languages.

## HOLY FAMILY CELEBRATES THE PASCAL TRIDUUM

The Paschal Triduum (from the Latin for "three days") was the three-day liturgical summit of Eastertime, which we celebrated to commemorating the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus, starting on Holy Thursday evening (April 2nd) and ending on Easter Sunday (April 5th). It includes Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil/Easter Sunday.

On Holy Thursday, here at Holy Family, we commemorated the Last Supper of Jesus where He washed the feet of His disciples (right) and instituted the Blessed Sacrament of the Eucharist when He pronounced the words of Institution (which Fr. Fred reprises at each Mass with the words of Institution, bringing the real presence of Jesus to us as His Body and Blood).



On Good Friday, we remembered the story of the Crucifixion by presenting the Way of the Cross (the Stations of the Cross) in theatre style, led by our Confirmation students and the Religious Education teachers (below), and then by the Veneration of the Cross on that Friday evening.



On Holy Saturday, we celebrated the Easter Vigil with the lighting of the Pascal Candle (right and at the bottom), the telling of the scriptural story of the Hebrew nation from Genesis to Abraham to Moses to Isaiah to Jesus, plus the recollection of the institution of the Eucharist, and the ceremony of light to commemorate the risen Lord along with the blessing of the baptismal water.



And of course, on Easter morning, we celebrated the Resurrection of Jesus, again with the Easter candle and His presence in the Eucharist. The somber view of the stripped altar and the covered statues was replaced on Easter morning with the blooming of flowers (below) marking the new birth of creation signifying the Resurrected Body of Jesus. The story of the women and the disciples going to the empty tomb was paramount in this liturgy. For the next weeks of Eastertide, our scriptures will recount how Jesus appeared to His followers as a Resurrected body - all in anticipation of his Ascension into heaven on Ascension Thursday (May 14th this year).



The Pascal Candle is newly molded each year from beeswax. On its front on the emblem of the Cross are five pieces of white incense to represent the five wounds of Jesus (each hand, each foot, and His side). The Greek letters A (alpha) and Ω (omega) - the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet signifying Jesus as the beginning and the end - are above and below the cross and the year 2026 is shown, indicating that this candle will be used during the entire year for celebrations such as baptisms.

## SUNDAY MASS READINGS FOR MAY

### Sunday, April 26th (Fourth Sunday of Easter)

**A reading from Acts of the Apostles 2:14, 36-41:** Another sermon from Peter delivered to the people assembled, where he told them to all to be baptized and repent from their sins in the name of Jesus Christ. About 3000 people were baptized that very day and added to the roll of those saved.

**Responsive Psalm 23:1-6: "The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want."**

**Epistle Reading from the First Letter of St. Peter 2:20-25:** You may suffer for doing what is right and just, but that is a grace from God. Just as Christ suffered, they may also suffer following in the footsteps of Jesus, who bore their sins upon the cross. If you have gone astray, return to the shepherd who is Jesus.

**Gospel of John 10:1-10:** Jesus reminds the people that He is the Good Shepherd and that He allows the people to enter into heaven like a shepherd allows the sheep to enter through the gates of the field. The shepherd calls the sheep by name and protects them from all evil. So too with Jesus.

### Sunday, May 3rd (Fifth Sunday of Easter)

**A reading from the Acts of the Apostles 6:1-7 -** The twelve Apostle got together to determine how they could help and support the widows of their communities. They decided that they would choose seven men who were filled with the Spirit. The Apostle laid hands on those seven to become deacons.

**Responsive Psalm 33:1-2, 4-5, 18-19 - "Lord, let your mercy be on us, as we place our trust in you."**

**Epistle Reading from the First Letter of Peter 2:4-9 -** Peter tells the people that they are the cornerstone of the Church, a chosen race, a royal priesthood and a holy nation.

**Gospel of John 14:1-12 -** Jesus tells his disciples that He has prepared a place for them in His Father's house. When Thomas asked where that place was, Jesus says that He is the way, the truth and the life, and that no one comes to the Father except through Him. Believe in Him and do His good works, and they will have eternal life with the Father.

### Sunday, May 10th (Sixth Sunday of Easter)

**A reading from the Acts of the Apostles 8:5-8, 14-17 -** Philip preached to the people of Samaria and they paid attention to his teaching. He baptized many and Peter and John then when to Samaria to lay hands on the people and they received the Holy Spirit.

**Responsive Psalm 66:1-3, 4-5, 6-7, 16, 20 - "Let all the earth cry out to God with joy."**

**Epistle Reading from the First Letter of Peter 3:15-18 -** Always show your hope to those who challenge you. Christ suffered for the sake of righteousness and was brought to life in the Spirit.

**Gospel of John 14:15-21 -** If you love Jesus and keep His commandments, He will ask the Father to send another Advocate to be with them. The world will no longer see Him, but the Apostles will see Him because He lives in them and He will reveal Himself to them.

**Sunday, May 17th (The Ascension of the Lord)**

**A reading from the Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11** - The beginning of Acts of the Apostles where Luke tells of Jesus having appeared to the disciples after His Resurrection and then gathering them on a mountain and was lifted up and a cloud took Him from their sight as He ascended into heaven.

**Responsive Psalm 47:2-3, 6-7, 8-9** - "God mounts his throne to shouts of joy: a blare of trumpets for the Lord."

**Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Ephesians 1:17-23** - John reminds the people that they have been given the Spirit of wisdom and revelation, with Jesus as the head over all things on earth.

**Gospel of Matthew 28:16-20** - The eleven Apostles gathered on the mountain with Jesus, who instructed them to go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them, telling them that He will be with them always.

**Sunday, May 24th (Pentecost)** - See page 5 for more information about this feast day.

**A reading from the Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11** - Our well-known story of the Disciples gathered in a room in hiding from the authorities after the Resurrection when a driving wind filled the room and tongues, as of fire, appeared over each of them and they were filled with the Holy Spirit. When they spoke to the crowd gathered outside, each of the visitors miraculously understood the Apostles speaking in their own languages.

**Responsive Psalm 104:1, 24, 29-30, 31, 34** - "Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth."

**Epistle Reading from St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians 12:3-7, 12-13** - We all have different gifts and different services and different works, but they all come from the same Spirit. In one Spirit we were all baptized into the one body of Christ.

**Gospel of John 20:19-23** - On the day after His Resurrection, Jesus appeared to the disciples and greeted them with "Peace be with you." Jesus told them that He had been sent by the Father, and then He breathed on them and gave them the power to forgive sins.

**Sunday, May 31st (Feast of the Holy Trinity)**

**A reading from Exodus 34:4-6, 8-9** - Moses went up Mount Sinai as the Lord had commanded him and took with him the tablets of the law. The Lord stood there with Moses and he bowed down in worship. Moses begged the Lord to pardon the wickedness and sinfulness of the people, and asked the Lord to receive the people as His own.

**Responsive Reading from Daniel 3:52, 53, 54, 55, 56** - "Glory and praise for ever!"

**Epistle Reading from St. Paul's Second Letter to the Corinthians 13:11-13** - Paul exhorts the people to live in peace, mend their ways and agree with one another. In that way, the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with them all.

**Gospel of John 3:16-18** - This is the well-known verse we hear often: "God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." God did not send His Son into the world to condemn it but that the world would be saved through Him
